Panel Making to Begin at the Episcopal Cathedral

The Episcopal Cathedral of St. Paul's HIV/AIDS Outreach Ministry is opening its doors to those individuals who wish to create a quilt panel to memorialize a loved one, friend, or family member who has died of AIDS. The first Quilting session will take place on Wednesday, October 11, 1995, 6:30 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. in the Cathedral's new facility at 134 West 7th Street.

Individuals will create 3 x 6 foot panels for eventual submission to the NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt. There they will be stitched together with seven other panels to create 12 x 12 foot squares. Currently the Quilt consists of over 33,000 individuals panels. The entire NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt covers over 16 acres.

What is the NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt? Between 1980 and 1987 more than 1,000 San Franciscan's (primarily gay men) died of AIDS. Overwhelmed by the lack of government response, Cleve Jones searched for a way to make the public understand what he and his friends were experiencing. Others searched for a way to express the unending grief they felt as friends and loved ones died.

In June of 1987, Jones gathered a small group of neighborhood residents in an empty Market Street storefront "to take all our individual experiences and stitch them together to make something that had strength and

beauty." It was there that the NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt began. The Quilt has become a powerful symbol of love, hope, healing, courage, pain and reconciliation.

Other segments included a line of racially mixed cheerleaders singing "Stop in the Name of Love" outside a rally of nonplussed Klansmen, and the show's producer treating Michigan Militia leaders to a peaceful, fun day at an amusement park.

Lesbian Mom Jailed for Refusing Ex's Visiting Rights

SALT LAKE CITY, Aug. 1—A lesbian mother was sailed after she repeatedly ignored orders to allow her for partner to see the son that they had co-parented. After the women separated, the non-biological co-parent, Angie Icaza, sued for visiting rights. The biological mother, known as C.D. was ordered in February to allow Angie Icaza to visit the boy. When the couple was together, Icaza had assumed all of the status responsibilities of a parent, and she has told the court she is willing to pay child support.

Briefs

ithaca, NY July 5—In a unanimous vote, the Common Council of Ithaca, New York has endoused same-sex marriages. The vote was a in the form of a nonbinding resolution.

Brazil June 24—A poll here shows 60 percent of Brazilians favors legalizing same-sex marriages. Same-sex marriage legislation is pending in the Brazilian legislature.

Latvia August 12—Two lesbians exchanged vows in a highly-publicized marriage ceremony in the former Soviet republic of Latvia. The couple and gay activists in Latvia say they hope the wedding will raise consciousness about lesbians and gay men and will help to overturn the ban on same-sex marriage.

Vancouver, B.C. Aug. 9—A Canadian doctor has been fined (almost \$2,480 U.S. dollars) for refusing to provide artificial insemination to a lesbian couple.





Roe: Lesbian Who Helped Legalize Abortion Switches Sides

DALLAS, Aug. 10—Norma McCorvey, best known as "Jane Roe" of the Roe v. Wade legal battle that helped legalize abortion nationwide, has joined Operation Rescue. She has also been baptized by the fundamentalist minister who is the president of Operation Rescue. That organization is a conservative Christian organization that blocks entrances to abortion clinics. McCorvey's sudden conversion doesn't seem to involve rejecting her lesbianism, which she proudly proclaimed in her 1994 autobiography, I Am Roe.

Clinton Executive Order

WASHINGTON, D.C., August 4, 1995—President Clinton has issued an executive order barring discrimination based on sexual orientation in the issuance of government security clearances. The order marks the first time a Presidential order specifically bars discrimination based on sexual orientation, and marks an end to the long-standing assumption that gays can't be trusted with national secrets. "The President's action is an important step toward eradicating job discrimination based on sexual orientation," said Melinda Paras, executive director of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force.

Unclear on the Concept: Coroner Rants Against Gay Men After Girl is Raped and Murdered

SPOKANE, Wash., Aug. 11—Rachel Carver, 9, was found dead on June 15. She had been beaten to death and repeatedly sodomized. Although there is no evidence whatsoever that Rachel was ever abused by a homosexual, Spokane County Coroner Dr. Dexter Amend blamed the sexual abuse and murder of Rachel on homosexuals. "She's been sodomized over and over and sodomy is a homosexual act," said Dr. Amend. "It's a crime that we don't expose the homosexual community, and it is not just a simple aberrant sexual activity. It is significant when it takes innocent minds like this Carver gal." Her uncle, has confessed to the killing, and court records show that Rachel's father, uncle and her mother's boyfriend are all suspected of molesting her in the past.

Amend's comments have outraged human rights activists in Spokane and nationwide, and have called into question the doctor's ability to perform his job as a medical official. The controversy has also stirred up scrutiny of the medical profession's homophobia and AIDSphobia.

According to a study published in July 1994 *Pediat-rics*, children are at least 100 times more likely to be molested by a heterosexual than a homosexual adult.

Zimbabwe President: Gays, Lesbians "Worse Than Dogs and Pigs"

HARARE, Zimbabwe—At Zimbabwe's International Book Fair, whose theme was human rights, Zimbabwe President Robert Mugabe angrily declared that gays don't have "any rights at all," and demanded that the gay rights stand be vacated. Internationally, Mugabe's stand was strongly denounced by gay activists, human rights organizations, book publishers, 70 U.S. congressmembers, authors of international stature, and others. The criticism only further inflamed Mugabe's anger, and he called gays and lesbians "worse than pigs and dogs," calling on Zimbabweans to arrest them and bring them to the police.

Male-on-Male Sexual Harassment Suit

MONTGOMERY, Ala. August 8—An alleged victim of male-on-male sexual harassment was awarded an undisclosed sum by a federal jury. It is possibly the first trial involving male-on-male sexual harassment in the workplace. Ford W. Prescott, 43, an employee at Independent Life and Accident Insurance Co., alleged that his boss, Tommy Lee Meeks repeatedly touched and fondled him, grabbed him in the crosch, and kissed him at a party. Meeks fired Prescott in 1993 for spreading rumors that Meeks was gay. Meeks was later fired for an unrelated reason.

Michigan: The *Jenny Jones Show* was sued for \$25 million by the family of the gay man who was killed after he declared his crush on a straight man on a Jones show about secret crushes.

Heeding Good Advice

Syndicated columnist An landers has retracted the homophobic advice she offered to one of her gay readers. In a June 15 column, landers had told a 52-year-old gay father that he should keep his lover home when attending his son's wedding. In her August 20th column, however, Landers now admits that her suggestion was "gutless." The advice guru credits an outpouring of "angry mail" for changing her position from wrong to right.

Landers begins her August 20th column by announcing: "I haven't had so much angry mail since I sided with the readers who insisted that the toilet paper should be hung so it goes behind the roll and falls close to the wall." "The issue that created the recent commotion," she explains, "is whether or not the gay father in Virginia should attend his son's wedding without Jason, his companion of 12 years." The father had informed Landers that "my son told me he did not want me to bring Jason to the wedding because some of his friends are not as understanding as he is, and he doesn't want to be embarrassed on his wedding day."

"My advice," Landers reminds her readers, "was to leave the decision up to Jason. I said, 'If he's a first-rate fellow, he will encourage you to attend his son's wedding without him." Since then, Landers reports, "The negative responses have been so heavy, my letter carrier has developed a hernia.

Landers candidly reprints several "samples of what I've been getting" and each letter bluntly challenges her bad advice: "You sure wimped out...," "Your advice stank...," "You really bombed..." She concludes: "So, dear readers, the people have spoken, and as usual, they are right." My advice to 'leave the decision to Jason' was gutless. I should have said, 'Tell your son if your life companion is not welcome, you won't be there. He needs educating, and this could be an important first step."

The significance of Landers' about-face is heightened by her status as one of the most historicallyentrenched and widely-read columnists in the world. It is


