

# In Memoriam: Ellen R. Beitel

Ellen R. Beitel, 37, passed away in her home from pancreatic cancer on Friday November 15, 1996. She is survived by her partner Charlotte Forsty-Kline, her parents Monte & Katie Erwin, her grandmother Mary Brewer, brother James, and sisters Kim Beitel and Sherry Seames. A lifetime resident of Ashtabula county, Ellen was the owner of the Leeward Lounge in Ashtabula.

Ellen was a model of strength and courage for Ashtabula's gay community. She always presented herself without apology, acted as a motherly defender of her sometimes-harassed bar patrons, and actively represented the gay community in local business organizations. She was also a champion fundraiser for the American Cancer Society, and several other charities. In particular, Ellen devoted much of her time and energy to the Ashtabula HIV/AIDS Task Force, which she helped to found seven years ago.

Ellen played a pivotal role building and maintaining the Ashtabula community. She served as the welcome wagon for many Ashtabulans, whether they had just moved in or just come out. The church was filled to


capacity for her memorial service with friends who loved her, and who valued her support and counsel. There were many more who, at the very least, knew her to be a fabulous hostess who promised an outrageously good time with every visit to the Leeward. For her exit song, Ellen chose to remind us of her strength and courage with her favorite Elvis rendition of "My Way". She could not have picked a better song to remind us of her outlook on life. She will be missed.

Lots of same-sex marriage and family material on TV during November. *Turning Point* did a special report, *Spin City* did an episode where Carter, a black gay activist arranges a publicity stunt aimed at raising awareness around same-sex marriage rights, 20/20 did a segment on Melissa Etheridge and Julie Cypher, and the November 26 episode of *Roseanne* featured Leon (Martin Mull) and his partner talking about adopting a child.

Correction: Ellen DeGeneres will not be hosting the 1997 Emmy Awards, but will be hosting the Grammys, as she did last year, and she won an *Emmy* nomination for *that* performance.

Speaking of Ellen DeGeneres, her show was recently moved to a later time slot (9:30), a sign that perhaps this much ballyhooed coming out will actually happen.

Showtime will air **Bastard Out of Carolina** in December, debuting on the 15th. The movie is based on lesbian author **Dorothy Allison**'s semiautobiographical book of the same name, and focuses on a young girl who suffers great sexual abuse. It was originally to have aired on TNT, but Ted Turner said they didn't want to handle it. Unfortunately, while at TNT, the lesbianism of Aunt Raylene (Diana Sewid) was cut from the film. Director Anjelica Huston said the abuse was the important issue of this film, not lesbianism.

In honor of the premiere of the **Ab Fab** movie **The Last Shout**, Comedy Central presents Ab Fab Jan. On January 1, 8 and 15 (all Wednesdays), Comedy Central will run three back-to-back episodes of the sitcom, 8-10 pm. (Repeating 2-4am). The movie will premiere on January 19, with episodes on that day running prior to the movie (11a.m. to 8 pm.).

It's not really new, but the British comedy **Are You Being Served?** has a flamboyant gay character, Mr. Humphries (played by John Inman) It airs on some PBS stations (WQLN/Ch. 54 11pm), (WNED/Ch. 17 on 9:30 pm. Saturdays).

A recurring gay character on **Chicago Hope** is researcher Dr. Robert Lawrence (Mark Benninghofen). The series has been exploring the interactions between Dr. Lawrence and Dr. Aaron Shutt ( **Alan Arkin**).

**Politically Incorrect with Bill Maher** is supposed to move from Comedy Central to ABC in January. Should be interesting to see if the show keeps its bite when it moves to network TV.

### Film & Video

Coming to the Movie Stop on December 31 is **The Celluloid Closet**. (Film buffs will enjoy this look at Hollywood's gay history). Now at the store: **Our Sons**, (how two women deal with their gay sons in very different ways) and **Gay Games IV** (competition in various athletic events at the 1994 games).

**John Ritter** is a kind rural gay man in the small-town drama **Sling Blade**, coming to theaters soon.

Catherine Deneuve plays a philosophy professor who falls for a female student in the new French thriller Les Voleurs (Thieves).

Out gay director **Nicholas Hytner**'s new project is an adaptation of Arthur Miller's **The Crucible**, about the Salem witch-hunts. Hytner says there are powerful parallels with today's religious right, persecution of gays and those old witch hunts.

The new Romeo and Juliet features a gay Mercutio. Gitzen Ruth is a comedy (!) about abortion rights, featuring Swoosie Kurtz as a lesbian pro-choice activist and Mary Kay Place as a pro-life person, with Burt Reynolds playing a right wing pro-life activist. At the center of it all is Ruth (Laura Dern) a pregnant substance abuser who is caught shoplifting and given the option of having a lighter sentence if she aborts her pregnancy.

Fans of women's golf will want to check out **The LPGA: The Unauthorized Version** by Liz Kahn (Group Fore \$29.95).

Out ice skater and 1996 US champion **Rudy Galindo** has gone professional, so watch for him in those competitions. He'll be performing in Erie at the Civic Center on January 9.


## Shopping

### **Travel**

We list a lot of out-of-town events, and that encourages travel and since a lot of our readers are younger inexperienced drivers or students new to the area, we're going to make winter travel tips a yearly feature.

First, give yourself extra time to get to your destination...allow at least an hour or more beyond what it takes to travel somewhere. This will allow for traffic problems, detours, missed turns, etc. Traveling at a relaxed pace is safer...if you do get there ahead of schedule, you can use the time to shop, sightsee, watch guys, watch girls, stop at a local coffeehouse, bar, or restaurant, etc.

Before traveling to an event out of town, check the weather forecast. This whole area gets weather that can be dangerous and even deadly in the winter. If you've never driven in snow that's zero- or near zero-visibility, you can't fully appreciate how frightening the experience is. If the weather is calling for that type of weather along your travel route, you're better off staying at home. (In fact, if it's really bad, the event organizers may have canceled the event). When you check the weather report, make sure you watch for what's going on along your travel route...things can be quite different from one area to the next.

Keep blankets in the car in case of trouble. Make sure there are enough for everyone.

It's a good idea to call ahead to make sure the event is still on (we provide phone numbers in our calendar

listings). If you can't get through to that number, you might try the Info-lines we have listed in our Resource Directory.

Be aware of the dangers of falling asleep at the wheel. A surprisingly large number of auto fatalities are caused by drivers falling asleep at the wheel. A number of you who travel to out-of-town events travel back the same night, so the risk of falling asleep is pretty strong. If you can afford to stay at a motel you'll probably enjoy your trip more. If you can't or won't do that, here are some tips: If there is more than one person in the car, at least one passenger should try to stay awake and keep the driver company. Don't keep the car too warm; in fact, the driver should crack the window a little to make sure some brisk air gets in. Don't listen to relaxing music...rock, high energy and talk radio are good to keep you awake.

And it goes without saying that if you're going to go drinking, someone should be a designated driver.



# **Episcopal diocese endorses** blessing of gay relationships

The Episcopal Diocese of Pennsylvania voted 176-96 to endorse the development of "a rite or rites for the blessing of committed relationships between persons of the same sex."

The diocese has 65,000 members, in Philadelphia and surrounding counties.

## Allies support rites in Elizabethtown

ELIZABETHTOWN, Pa.—Heterosexuals in this district angrily protested an anti-gay resolution adopted by the Elizabethtown school board. The "pro-family" resolution, passed by the predominately conservative Christian board, condemned the idea of gay and lesbian parents, and was also critical of family units other than the traditional nuclear family ideal. On October 9 and 10, 250 students protested the resolution by walking out. Nearly 800 people protested at the board's October 15 meeting.

### Same-sex domestic violence

Partners in same-sex couples are more likely to be hurt by domestic violence than by gay-bashers, according to a study by the National Coalition of AntiViolence Programs. The study was based on reports from six US cities, and found that in four of those cities, there were more cases of domestic violence than antigay violence.

## Former task Force head appointed

Virginia M. Apuzzo, who served for several years as director of the National Gay Task Force (now the NGLTF) has been appointed as associated deputy secretary at the U.S. Department of Labor.

# How to make your meeting or event a success

Keeping our region's lesbigay community informed about what is going on is something we feel proud of. We deeply appreciate those who help us.

The single biggest problem we run into (by far!) is getting info after it's too late or as we are laying out the newsletter. You would not believe what we've left out because we get info after it can be used.

Let's look at the process backwards. Folks pick up and read the newsletter. If they see something only a day or two before it's happening (or the day of) they are much less likely to go. This is why if you have something in the early days of December, people need to read about it in the November issue. Before we can get the newsletter out, we obviously have to have it printed. We usually drop it off at the print shop on a Monday morning and get it back late Thursday or Friday afternoon and collate Thursday (or more likely Friday) night. So, that's an entire business week that nothing can enter the newsletter and that no one can read it. That's 1/6 of our entire cycle (1 month.)

Before we can drop the newsletter off, it has to be laid out. Fitting in all the articles and ads can be quite time consuming and frustrating at times. Sometimes stuff has to be cut because of space. Articles that arrive late are more likely to not be included if they aren't timely, or there is a space crunch and they arrived late. Let's face it, if you have moved into a new house and arranged the living room, a new sofa that is offered when you are rushing off to work is likely to be put on hold. This takes a couple of days to do, more if we try to accommodate last minute changes, or have to wait for pieces that are late.

And to accurately lay out the newsletter, we need to have all the pieces entered-articles typed in, ads laid out, etc. It's a good idea to have all the ingredients before you bake the cake. We also have to allow a few days to get someone a copy to proof, and enter the corrections. (And this someone needs to be someone who hasn't been staring it, until it becomes little black ants of type.)

A few times, folks have asked us whether it is easier to give something over the phone. When you send written copy, you are much more in control of what is said. You are much less likely to get misspellings. If you have looked at it first in written form, you are more likely to catch omissions (a starting time, contact info, etc.) It's also much more clear what needs to be run and what is just a

parenthetical remark. We'll take stuff over the phone if it is really unavoidable, but we are not stenographers nor do we take shorthand. This means that you will almost certainly spend more time waiting for us to type from spoken instructions than just writing down your information, and e-mailing it, faxing it or slapping on a stamp on it and mailing it. E-mail is our first choice if possible, as it eliminates rekeying (and decrease the likelihood of typos), but any written form is good.

The TV listings used to be one of the last things we got and the main bottleneck. We expect to now get it first class and maybe a week or so earlier. This is terrific, because it means that "hell week", when we frantically put the last items into the newsletter and lay it out, need not be quite so stressed and rushed. This also means we will need to be much tighter about the deadline of the 15th of the month. Go a day or two past, and you're probably okay. A week may very well be pushing it. Go past the last weekend of the month (or earlier, depending on when layout happens) and you are probably too late. When you ad in the time to edit, layout, proof and print, you can see why we need to get stuff by the 15th to get it to others by the first of the month.

Trigon did a wonderful job of getting their 18 and Over Party promoted. They had their plans at least partially set 4 weeks before their event. (If you are doing anything that you want some degree of publicity for, make sure you get at least the basic facts out by a bare minimum 4 weeks before the event.) There was still some details they had to settle, but at least there was something to go on. They made up a flyer with the facts, which they could not only give to us to type in, but they could post in other places and give to other people and sources. Womynspace sends us their very nicely worded event announcements about 6 weeks before they happen. Most of the people who go to the December meeting will get their copy of the December issue there. (Who needs to look down and read what you're doing, when you're already doing it?) So, in mid-October, Womynspace told us what they were doing in December, so the women at the November meeting would know what they had to look forward to at the December meeting.

Remember: plan at least 4 weeks ahead, write it down, and get your info in as many places as possible and you increase your chances of success!

# Sex & Health

## Study: Some are making up their own definition of monogamy

Ever since the early days of the AIDS crisis, monogamy has been promoted as the safest sex you can have. Some AIDS educators suggest that safer sex can be dispensed with once one is in a monogamous relationship.

In recent years, it has become plain that there are problems with that emphasis.

One problem is that much HIV transmission is going on between people (straight, gay and bi) in monogamous relationships. People fall in love, and abandon safer sex practices without getting tested for HIV. The results can be tragic.

Now researchers have found that while the number of gay men in monogamous couples tripled between 1984 and 1990, "what many individuals define as monogamy is highly suspect."

The researchers, from Pomona College in California, found that gay men now "talk more publicly about their long-term relationships, while often retaining the same number of partners." They stated that some "individuals hold two separate definitions of monogamy: One

is defined by sexual exclusivity and the other is defined by emotional exclusivity."

In other words, some gay men are developing and keeping an *emotional* relationship with one person, and calling that monogamy, even though they have *sexual* relations with other people.

"By deciding that love, not sex, is the critical defining element for monogamy," the researchers wrote, "individuals can rationalize that their relationship is monogamous because they are emotionally faithful to their partner."

# HIV testing and counseling for couples

Couples can take their HIV tests together at the Erie County Department of Health. The Department can also provide information and counseling on safer sex issues for couples. Call them at 451-6700.
