





Kuzmin stated that the employees who had been working Lizzy's will definitely be kept on.

"I have no problems with anyone coming here," he emphasizes. "Everyone is welcome."

## **Greg Rabb campaign results**

### from Greg Rabb

Unfortunately we did not win a seat, but there were only 275 votes between me and victory. I received a total of 3,103 (not counting the absentee votes). Even though we didn't win a seat, we did so well that we will do it again. We did so well that people still think we in



even though we didn't. We created a beautiful ideasonly campaign and built up incredible name recognition. There were several factors not in our favor:

The four people who did better than me were all locals-born and raised-people voted for them because they knew them as kids. I'm not a local, even though I've lived here for 12 years. Each of the candidates who did better is Italian-American-an important factor in a heavily Italian community where many people vote based on ethnic ties. Also, each is or had been on the council, and none were openly gay. The 275 more votes I needed to win is less than 10% of the votes I received. If only 9 to 10 more people in each election district in Jamestown had voted for me we would have won. This was my first race in Jamestown and we came out of nowhere and almost won. My votes were because of issues and myself, so there is a depth of commitment that isn't there for the others. The local newspaper couldn't attack me, so they ignored me-my press release announcing my campaign never was printed.

The Democrats did very well county-wide and many admit that it was in part because of all the people who came to their help via my campaign. We have input into policy for the next two to four years.

And finally *there was not one overtly anti-gay incident* in the whole campaign. I'm proud to say that because I'm not sure that would happen in a lot of places.

I can go back now to dealing with my job, the local HIV crisis,

## **Opinion: Sex education after Nushawn**


There are some occasions when there is just no pleasure in being able to say, "I told you so."

Such is the case with the Nushawn Williams tragedy, in which one heterosexual man infected numerous girls with HIV, and put countless others at risk.

Media reports have had parents and columnists asking, "What can we do to get students to hear the AIDS message?" Over and over again, we read and hear about how teenagers just don't believe anything can happen to them...and what more can we do?

The thing is, unlike the drinking-and-driving message, adults are not in agreement about what students should hear about AIDS and safer sex. In many communities, some religious conservatives are very vocal about any sort of sex education, and fight against any but the most watered down messages (unless, of course, it is abstinence). AIDS education has been a particularly controversial target, since it is still seen as a gay disease that doesn't really affect heterosexuals. Kathleen Whitmore, AIDS educator at AIDS Community Services' Southern Tier office expressed anger about the sudden concern. She notes that in many classes she can't even use the word "condom." How much of an AIDS prevention message is that?

The fact is, many teens *are* sexually active. Two-thirds of American high school students have already had sex. There is an epidemic of sexually transmitted disease among U.S. teens of all sexual orientations. There is also an epidemic of teen pregnancy. Now, you can either deal with that reality or, like the anti-sex education types, pretend that if we say "Abstinence!" long enough, the kids will all cross their legs and wait for marriage.



Even though polls have shown that a majority of parents want the schools to teach comprehensive sex education, their will is often blocked by a vocal minority who seem to be afraid of what this information might do to children.

I'm not sure what these people imagine when they think about sex educators. I guess I think it's a good thing because, although there wasn't much sex education available at school when I was a teenager, I was counseled by two adults who gave me some pretty important advice. It happened when I was 16, and had become sexually active with my boyfriend Steve. His parents accepted our having a sexual relationship, but strongly advised we go for advice. Our first stop was the minister at the Unitarian Society, which his family belonged to. The minister gave out an exasperated sigh, and asked "You really can't wait on this?" When we explained that we'd already started having sex, he sat down and counseled us on having a responsible sexual relationship. He then suggested going to Planned Parenthood, which used to have an office in Erie. At the Planned Parenthood office, the counselor took me aside and asked me, "Are you sure this is something you want? You aren't just doing this to keep him? You don't have to have sex now, you know." I assured her it was something we both wanted, and she then gave both of us some information on how to avoid my becoming pregnant with a child that neither of us would have wanted or been ready for. If either of these adults had told us to abstain, we would have ignored them. They made it clear they had misgivings about it, but their tone was, Well, as long as you're going to have sex anyway, here's how to do it without getting hurt. (Compare this with the "If you drink, don't drive" ad campaign. This approach is successful in keeping at least some drunk drivers off the road. If they had said, "Just don't drink," who would have paid attention?).

The point I'm trying to make here is that sex educators don't urge kids on. Lord knows their own bodies do that. What sex educators *can* do is to help young people understand what's going on with their bodies and emotions, how to prevent becoming infected with any of a number of diseases (some permanent and/or fatal), how to avoid unwanted pregnancies, and how to successfully practice safer sex (and that last one needs a lot of discus-

sion and reinforcement). Dr. Peter Piot, who heads the Joint UN Program on AIDS states that scientific research shows sex education doesn't promote more sexual activity, but it does lower rates of pregnancy and STDs.

Most adults, regardless of their political beliefs or sexual orientation, believe teenagers would probably be better off if they put off sexual activity at least until they're out of high school. And, in fact, an inner-city Washington DC school has a program for girls that encourages abstinence, with excellent results. But the program has to work hard on issues like the girls' self-esteem, goals for their futures, peer pressure, and assertiveness. Also, it's important to note that these girls *chose* to be in the program; it's harder to promote abstinence to a general student population. And, not to be sexist, but it's questionable whether boys would be so enthusiastic about enrolling in a similar program.

In the meantime, what about all those other kids, in public schools and religious schools alike, who are going to go on boinking regardless of what their elders want, regardless of what's in the curriculum, regardless of what "traditional values" dictates?

Can we deal with that now?

There is a strand of thought in some people's religious beliefs which insists that if you have sex without marriage, you should suffer some negative consequences. We should ask those who work against providing frank sex education to please look into their hearts and ask if they really think a kid should suffer because s/he's ignorant of the consequences. Do they really want to organize to accomplish that?

A good part of the fight against good sex education comes from the religious conservatives' concern for morality. But much of their idea of morality heavily consists of telling kids that they shouldn't be using their naughty parts. Well, now it's time to repudiate their exclusive claim on sexual morality. Because when you know how to keep kids from getting sick, or dying, or having unwanted pregnancies, and you try to keep that knowledge from them, then THAT is deeply, deeply immoral.

The only truly moral response is to do whatever it takes to keep them well. And if some peoples' "moral" teachings clash with that, they need to decide what's more important—*their* version of morality, or the health of a generation.

## HIV/AIDS News One-third of HIV + persons not aware they're infected

Researchers at the Centers for Disease Control estimate that about 275,000 Americans are infected with HIV and don't know it. Put another way, that means that one out of three of the people in this country who have HIV don't know they can infect their sexual partners, and aren't taking advantage of therapies that could help them. The CDC estimates approximately 775,000 Americans have HIV.

## Report: protease inhibitors fail in about half of patients

Although the new class of AIDS treatments called protease inhibitors has improved the health of many with HIV/AIDS, others have had more disappointing results.

A report reveals that the virus rebounded in about half of 163 patients at the AIDS Clinic of the University of California at San Francisco General Hospital. The drugs most often fail in the following types of patients: (1)Those who took other AIDS drugs before protease inhibitors were available,(2) Those who had low-T-cell counts before they started therapy, and (3) Those who don't keep up with the frustrating demands of the therapy.

Dr. David Ho of the Aaron Diamond AIDS Research Center in New York City said that the main reason that the therapy doesn't work is the patient's failure to keep up with its excruciating demands. "Compliance is a major issue," said Dr. Ho, "There is so little margin for underdosing. In our experience, that's the most frustrating aspect.



To illustrate the ACLU's commitment to gay and lesbian rights the following story is reprinted from the ACLU's current national newsletter:

### To be Young and Gay in Washington State

It began as a rumor among students that 15 year old Mark Iversen was gay. Those rumors soon turned into verbal bombshells, followed by threats of physical violence. Slurs were hurled at him daily, a student rammed him into a wall of lockers with a broomstick. In October of 1996, 30 students sat back and watched as he was beaten in a classroom.

Teachers did little to come to Mark's help. Two teachers witnessed the broomstick assault, but they did nothing to stop it. Another teacher told him: "I already have 20 girls in my class, I don't need another."

School administrators were of no help; in fact, the principal told Mark's parents that the young man had brought on the harassment himself.

In July 1997, one month after he graduated from Hentwood High in Seattle, Mark Iversen and his parents went into federal court against the school district for failing to stop the harassment.

Citing the school district's own anti-harassment policies, the lawsuit seeks to "make it crystal clear" that the policy includes all forms of harassment, including over sexual orientation. The lawsuit wants the district to require training for teachers in lesbian and gay issues, and seeks compensatory damages for violating Mark's equal protection and due process rights.

"Every student should be able to attend school without suffering verbal and physical abuse," said Kathleen Taylor, Washington State ACLU Executive Director. "We brought this lawsuit to prevent future students from being harassed because they are lesbian or gay."





## In the Life's 1997 Year-in-Review

The next episode of In the Life airs on December 12 at 10 p.m. on WQLN PBS-Erie/Channel 54. It will contain these stories:

#### AIDS and Sex in 1997

The close of 1996 brought protease inhibitors and the hope that a cure was on its way. This hope, however, ushered in a year filled with debate and division, mostly between AIDS activists and academics, over AIDS prevention messages and methods. Some warn of a new increased spread of the disease, especially among young gay men who are practicing unsafe sex in the belief that with protease inhibitors, AIDS can be fended off; others, like the activist group called Sex Panic, warn that calls for monogamy by a gay male media elite, or "neo-cons," means the eventual "death of queer culture." This story will examine this debate to find out how the core of each message is playing to the general population, and how prevention messages are being crafted for 1998. A Day in the Life: Dr. Kote O'Hanlon:

IN THE LIFE spends the day with Dr. Kate O'Hanlon, a leading expert in the field of Gynecologic Oncology at Stanford Medical Center. O'Hanlon has authored many studies including "Homophobia as a Health Hazard" and "Lesbian Health and Homophobia," both published in national medical journals. During this day with Dr. O'Hanlon viewers are introduced to her wife of 11 years, attend a "Grand Rounds" with Stanford Medical Staff on the effects of homophobia, witness an operation, observe regular check-ups . . . and at some point, go home!

#### 1997 Theater Year-in -Review

One theme that stood out among this year's plays that focused on gay issues in 1997 was history. This segment considers three productions which, taken together, outline a century of society's treatment of homosexuals, both on-stage and off. These shows include the musical On the Town with Lea DeLaria, the 30th anniversary starstudded reading of The Boys in the Band, and a major success of the theater season, Gross Indecency: The Three Trials of Oscar Wilde.

#### The 1997 Year in Media

In 1997 stories about gay and lesbian people grabbed the attention of the national media. The good news and bad news of this phenomenon can summed up in two names—Ellen DeGeneres and Andrew Cunanan. In the spring of 1997 gay people across America cheered the first "prime time lesbian," both the character and the actress, and Ellen's coming out party was a national event. But just a few months later a "homicidal homosexual" became the obsession of media outlets replete with stories of kept boys and gay sex. Put simply, "gay" sold in 1997—in major newspapers and newscasts. For this story In the Life asks gay men and lesbians how they felt about the coverage and the ride.

#### "In the Line of Fire": The Promisekeepers

This season IN THE LIFE introduces a new regular feature called "In the Line of Fire," which will focus on the clash between the gay civil rights movement and antigay activity which works to resist its progress. This episode's "In the Line of Fire" segment will examine the connections between the Conservative Right and the Promise Keepers movement, and the possible future implications for the gay community. *In the Life* travels to Washington D.C. for the "Stand in the Gap" rally, to find out first hand how individual members and the leaders of the Promise Keepers regard gay men and lesbians, and whether a movement that has declared itself "non-political" should be of concern to gay rights activists. **Documenting Gay History** 

In addition to theater, the 1997 season in music, photography and film also worked to examine and document gay history. This segment throws a spotlight on Germany by examining a 4-CD box set entitled *Club Verboten*, a photo exhibit called 100 Years of the Gay Rights Movement in Germany, and the film Bent. Originally stage play, Bent follows the lives of two men in the 1930s as they are transported from gay Berlin to the concentration camps of Hitler's Nazi Germany.

#### A Tribute

This episode ends with a tribute to role models of the gay community who passed away this year: Allen Ginsberg and Tom Stoddard. Their stories will be reflected through the eyes of their long term partners.
