



## Michael dithers

I would like to thank everyone who made this year's picnic such a success! See the article in the Local News on page 7 for more info.

We weren't expecting coverage by local TV news, but I thought it was incredibly cool that four people all chose to speak on camera and everyone of them chose to use their face and full name. I am trying to remember how many years it has been since we last had anyone use only their first name or an alias or have their face/voice obscured.

There are still those who are afraid. One person I was speaking to the night of the picnic was worried he might have been in a crowd shot and possibly lose his job. I checked with the Erie City Solicitor, the Erie County Human Relations Commission and the Pennsylvania State Human Relations Commission. Existing state and federal statutes do not cover discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation in housing, employment, etcetera. The Erie County Human Relations Commission currently only enforces laws that exist at the state level. However, the

It makes you wonder if they can take a stand for equal rights in Pittsburgh, why can't we do it here?

Micheal and I recently celebrated our fifth wedding anniversary on June 18th. We had a nice dinner out, and then went to Cleveland Pride the next day. There was a pretty good showing from Erie folks.

I think that it is pretty much common knowledge that my family seems to produce more than a few GLBT folks. I was recently talking with my great uncle (who is gay) about my direct maternal great grandfather (also gay). It turns out that my great-grandfather, Nelson Dragoon, had been gay bashed in the late 30's. It was sort of a similar situation that happened with my late bisexual father in the mid 1970's: we both knew that our father had been assaulted, but we didn't find out until years later that the motivation was anti-gay.

I hope that everyone who came to the Pride Erie Picnic had a good time. I think we're all looking forward to the 2nd Erie Pride Rally on Saturday, October 9. Helen has been doing a great job of coordinating this.

The March on Washington should be exciting too. It is set for Sunday, April 30, 2000. Hopefully, we will be able to get a good contingent of Erie folks there. Micheal and I have a particular interest because the last March occurred just a few weeks after we met. He wasn't able to get time off from work, so this kind of represents the first trip together we would have liked to have taken together. We just had to wait a while, that's all. We might also get to see the aforementioned great uncle, who lives in Laurel, MD.

You may have read the article about the decision by Judge Shad Connelly to not allow a second parent adoption to a local gay man. There is at least one aspect of this decision that I find to be quite irritating. Judge Connelly made his decision without even having the scheduled hearing or doing the home study. Jeff and Joey didn't even get their day in court. After hearing them speak at a PFLAG meeting some time ago, it was incredibly obvious that they loved and cared for their children. Maybe if people looked at all of the human beings in a family and didn't stop at the genitals, they might gain a greater degree of understanding.

## Local man denied 2nd parent adoption

In an article on the front page of the Sunday, June 20th edition of the Erie Daily Times (ironically, on Father's Day), Ed Palattella wrote about the recent decision of Judge Shad Connelly not to grant a second parent adoption of two children to Jeff, an Erie man, simply because he and his partner are gay. His partner, Joey, is currently the legal parent by adoption. Judge Connelly made his decision on Friday, June 18, without having the hearing or a home study. The Times News became aware of the decision before what should have been the home study on Monday, June 21 or the scheduled hearing of Thursday, June 24. Ed Palattella had contacted Michael Mahler for comment, who recognized the couple. Mahler then contacted Jeff and learned that the court date had not taken place. Jeff and Joey could have elected to pull the petition and were effectively denied that option. It was the couple's belief that the judge should at least have heard the case and made a decision based on the individual circumstances and the best interests of the children. If it had not been for a series of coincidences, they would not even have been aware that a legal decision had been made about their family without so much as a hearing or home study until reading it in the Sunday paper.

Jeff and Joey had been raising the boy and the girl almost since each was born. The children are 6 and 8. They call Joey 'Daddy' and Jeff 'Dada'. They may appeal Judge Connelly's decision that only one man may be the adoptive parent. There have been other cases in Pennsylvania, one of them in Erie County, where a judge granted a same sex partner a second parent adoption. Judge Connelly cited the Pennsylvania law prohibiting same-sex marriages. He also disputed the validity of the decision of Judge John T. Miller of York County who granted a second parent adoption to a woman in December 1993. No other decision granting a second parent adoption has been appealed currently. The decisions are not considered to have set a legal precedent because they came from lower court judges. Judges traditionally have had discretionary powers in adoption cases with regard to applying statutes.

Jeff was trying to make sure that the children would be entitled to insurance and other benefits of both parents, rather than just the currently legally recognized parent. Jeff went so far as to have his last name changed to Joey's surname. President Judge Michael Palmisano granted this request in June of 1998.

Both Judge Connelly and Judge Stanley Ott of Montgomery County stated in decisions quoted in the *Times News* article that because the law does not explicitly permit second parent same sex adoption, and because of the ban on same sex marriage and because of other laws, that the Pennsylvania State Legislature would have to explicitly permit such adoptions. Currently, only Florida bans gay and lesbian people from adopting children. Adoptions by the legal parent's partner is unclear or forbidden in many areas. Decisions have gone both ways in Pennsylvania.

Judge Ott said in his January 1996 decision to deny a second parent adoption to a lesbian couple that arguments about serving the best interests of the child "are better addressed to the Legislature, which, if it agrees,


can easily amend the existing adoption statute. Until it does so, the Orphans' Court is powerless to approve a 'second parent' or 'same sex' adoption."

Jeff and Joey have taken as many legal steps as possible to provide for the well being of their children. Joey, who is currently the legally recognized parent, has named his partner Jeff as the children's guardian in his will. However, even with these and other attempts to provide for the children, it is still possible that an insurance company or other agency could challenge Jeff's parental standing in court. Even with a will, there are still special rights that married heterosexual couples enjoy that are denied to gay couples. Jeff recognizes that the real measure of a family is how they love each other and concluded by saying "That's the one thing about the ruling, it won't change the way we live. And that's the neat thing."

In a recent unrelated case in Indiana, a married man got the support of his church and others in fighting the adoption of his foster daughter by a gay couple. He later admitted to having sex with the girl 'many times' in the past year after being reported to the police by his wife.

### Web browsing

Walk in so many Pride parades last month that your rainbow rings got all tarnished? Christopher Lonyo, who was/is the Christopher in PrideGifts by Christopher has a new web site, AllPride.Com, where you can find a new set, among many other things, to show your pride.

The Internet is increasingly becoming a boon to LGBT's and the people who have things of specific interest to them. Many companies with products targeting gay people are finding it easier to reach their audience directly through the web. Now there's a service called **eCommunity** whereby companies can learn online how well they are marketing their products to the LGBT community using message boards, chat tooms, emails and the like in which gay people are free to voice their opinions about products and ad campaigns directly to the companies that produce them. eCommunity is a part of the www.Gay.com Network.

In the same spirit of direct marketing, many musicians with queer or 'alternative' audiences are finding a

niche for reaching their LGBT fans by releasing their albums through the Internet, sidestepping the usual big record company marketing costs. The music is downloaded from the Internet in what is called an MP3 format, which has near-CD quality sound but requires only a fraction of the memory space or download time that would be taken up by a typically huge music file. The MP3 files require a special program that can read and play the format, but there are plenty of programs on the Internet that can be downloaded at low cost or even no cost - WinAmp, for Windows users and MacAmp for Mac users are the 2 most popular. Go to www.MP3.com and you will find lots of info, programs, and lists of artists with MP3 music to download. You can also try going to home pages of your favorite artists and seeing if they have any MP3 releases available. Boy George, Taylor Dayne and Pete Townsend are all good candidates. Oh, and lest you're worried that you have to be stuck in front of your PC to listen to MP3's, there's also a portable player.

Another service in the direct web marketing spirit is **www.DLSIJPress.com** which publishes books by women authors which you can download directly onto your PC or buy in print versions.

A very PC response to yet another one of Jerry Falwell's homophobic rants. If you look at June 22's Advocate you'll see a great ad with a back shot of two guys holding hands with what appear to be other parade celebrants ahead of them. The ad is sponsored in honor of Pride Month by Anheuser-Busch with a tag line of "Be yourself and make it a Bud Light" in rainbow colors. Falwell urged a protest and boycott against Anheuser-Busch for its campaign which appears in numerous other gaytargeted publications besides the Advocate. As reported in the same issue of the *Advocate*, Anheuser-Busch responded to Falwell's attack by stating, "Today's consumer is not one of a specific gender, race, geography or orientation. We appreciate and respect the views of all our customers." Cheers. And cheers to all of the other advertisers that placed gay-affirming ads during the month of June and especially those that continue to do so throughout the year. As for Falwell, what the hell (purgatory?) are we going to do with this guy and his followers?
