

#### Some Positive Primary Election Results

Low voter turnouts and new touch-screen voting machines seemed to dominate the news following the May 16 primary election, but for the local GLBT community, the results produced some optimistic results.

Rep. Teresa Forcier of Crawford County, an extreme right-wing Republican who has proudly supported anti-gay measures in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, was defeated in the GOP primary by newcomer Brad Roae. Although Roae did not respond to the Erie Gay News (EGN) candidate ques-

tionnaire, it is hard to imagine he could be worse than Forcier. Roae will face Democrat Keith Abbott in the fall.

In Erie's First Legislative District, the threecandidate Democratic race to replace GLBT-friendly Linda Bebko-Jones was won by Pat Harkins. Harkins responded to the EGN candidate survey and provided relatively positive answers, although he was vague about marriage and civil union issues. He will face Republican Christine Pontoriero in November. She did not respond to the EGN survey.

Democrat Dennis Iaquinta, one of Harkins' opponents, ran a disturbing ad in the Sunday *Erie Times-News* prior to the election which indicated he would not support same-sex marriage or civil unions.

Incumbent Republican Matthew Good of Millcreek, who has been supportive of GLBT issues, won the GOP primary in the Third District. He will face Republican-turned-Democrat John Hornaman in November. Hornaman did not respond to the EGN candidate questionnaire. Also on the November ballot will be Green Party candidate Tim Reim, who is supportive of GLBT issues.

Republican incumbent John Evans, who has been somewhat supportive of GLBT issues, survived a primary challenge in the Fifth District. Evans will face Democrat Jason White in the fall. White gave some very positive responses to the EGN candidate survey.

Democrat Flo Fabrizio had no opponents in the Second District from either party. He didn't respond to the EGN questionnaire, but in the past, has been quite supportive of GLBT issues.

Republican Curt Sonney also had no opposition in either party in the Fourth District. Unfortunately, as a sponsor of the proposed anti-marriage amendment to the state constitution, Sonney does not appear to be a friend of the GLBT community.

#### A Hush Fell Over the Halls of McDowell High School on April 26 by Michael R. Komo

On Wednesday, April 26, over 250 students at McDowell High School took a vow of silence. These students were participating in the National Day of Silence. The individuals who partook in this event were silent from the beginning of the school day until the end of the school day.

The Day of Silence, a project of the Gay, Lesbian and Straight Education Network (GLSEN) in collaboration with the United States Student Association (USSA), is a student-led day of action where those who support making anti-LGBT bias unacceptable in schools take a day-long vow of silence to recognize and protest the discrimination and harassment — in effect, the silencing — experienced by LGBT students and their allies.

I, along with a few other students, organized the event at McDowell. My original goal was to get 200 students registered for it. I was pleasantly surprised to see that over 250 individuals (grades nine through twelve) signed up for the Day of Silence. My goal for 2007 is to get 300 students registered for the event.

There were many students who support LGBT rights but chose not to participate in the event. Some had scheduled presentations that they could not reschedule. Others had to teach lessons at elementary schools that day. However, they gave their full support for those of us who did participate.

The event was quite a success. For the most part, the students not participating respected those individuals who were. Teachers and faculty members commended our efforts. There was minimal opposition to this event, as there is with many things. However, doing the right thing is not always easy. We kept that in mind and held our heads high that day.







#### **Schools Can Ban Clothing Slogans**

A U.S. appeals court has ruled that public schools can bar clothing with derogatory slogans. The ruling came in a case involving a student who wore a T-shirt to school saying "Homosexuality is shameful."

In the 2-1 decision by the U.S. 9th Circuit Court of Appeals, the judges backed a San Diego-area high school that ordered a student to remove a T-shirt with the anti-gay message. School officials were concerned the slogan could raise tensions at the school, where there had been conflict between gay and straight students. The student in question sued, claiming the school's dress code violated his free speech, religious freedom and due process rights.

Writing for the court's majority, Judge Stephen Reinhardt affirmed a lower court's decision against an injunction against the school and said schools may bar slogans believed to be hurtful.

Students "who may be injured by verbal assaults on the basis of a core identifying characteristic such as race, religion, or sexual orientation, have a right to be free from such attacks while on school campuses," Reinhardt wrote.

"The demeaning of young gay and lesbian students in a school environment is detrimental not only to their psychological health and well-being, but also to their educational development," the judge added.

Judge Alex Kozinski, who sided with the student, wrote that the court's majority would gag campus dissent to Poway (CA) High School's policies.

"The types of speech that could be banned by the school authorities under the Poway High School hate policy are practically without limit. Any speech code that has at its heart avoiding offense to others

gives anyone with a thin skin a heckler's veto — something the Supreme Court has not approved in the past," Kozinski wrote.

Reinhardt rejected this argument.

"Perhaps our dissenting colleague believes that one can condemn homosexuality without condemning homosexuals. If so, he is wrong. To say that homosexuality is shameful is to say, necessarily, that gays and lesbians are shameful," Reinhardt wrote.

"There are numerous locations and opportunities available to those who wish to advance such an argument. It is not necessary to do so by directly condemning, to their faces, young students trying to obtain a fair and full education in our public schools," Reinhardt added.

# Massachusetts Postpones Constitutional Convention

Lawmakers in Massachusetts will wait until July to consider several proposed amendments to the state's Constitution, including making health care access a right and outlawing gay marriage.

Robert Travaglini, president of the Massachusetts State Senate said that the constitutional convention scheduled to begin in May would be postponed because the Senate is currently preparing its budget and advancing "other important initiatives."

"It would be prudent to postpone the constitutional convention until a later date in July," he said in a statement.

The Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court is currently reviewing a lawsuit by gay marriage activists that could make the proposed gay marriage constitutional amendment moot.

The amendment to be considered at the constitutional convention would define marriage as the union of one man and one woman. However, gay marriage supporters argue that such an amendment would violate the state constitution, which bars any citizen-initiated amendment that seeks to reverse a judicial ruling.

The current lawsuit is being heard by the same court that in a landmark 2003 ruling, cleared the way for same-sex marriages to begin in Massachusetts. More than 7,000 gay couples have married in the state since gay marriages became legal in May 2004.

# "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" Suit Filed Again

The Log Cabin Republicans have refiled their federal challenge to "don't ask, don't tell," one month after a California federal judge ruled that the group lacked standing to sue on behalf of unnamed members.

The gay Republican political group named former Army intelligence officer Alex Nicholson as its new plaintiff, along with other anonymous Log Cabin members, described as "John Does," who are still serving in the armed forces. Last month, a California federal judge dismissed the group's challenge to the Pentagon's "don't ask, don't tell" policy on technical grounds.

The challenge, filed by the Log Cabin Republicans in October 2004, had originally been lodged on behalf of unnamed members of the Log Cabin group, who had either served or were currently serving in the armed forces. In his ruling, Judge George Schiavelli said the group did not have standing to sue as an asso-

ciation unless it could prove that one or more of its members had standing to sue as individuals. Since the Log Cabin Republicans declined to name anyone affected by the ban on open gay service, that test had not been met, Schiavelli wrote.

In his ruling however, Schiavelli gave the Log Cabin Republicans an extension to refile the suit on behalf of specific, named individuals.

The Servicemembers Legal Defense Fund has also filed a suit challenging "don't ask, don't tell." That suit, Cook v. Rumsfeld, was argued in federal court in Boston last summer and is awaiting a ruling. Regardless of the outcome, this case involving 12 former service members is expected to proceed to the U.S. Court of Appeals and a possible petition to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Both lawsuits are the first challenges to the military's anti-gay policy since the Supreme Court decision in Lawrence v. Texas, which struck down a key legal support for "don't ask, don't tell" by ruling that governments could not criminalize private noncommercial sex between consenting adults. Prior to Lawrence, government lawyers could point out that the military was justified in setting limits on an activity that was classified as a felony in several states.

# **Proposed Moscow Pride Parade in Danger**

Moscow's first Gay Pride parade faces an uncertain future after anti-gay protesters hurling eggs and bottles, forced a Moscow nightclub to cancel a major gay and lesbian party.

Organizers were hoping to attract about 1,000 people to the Renaissance Event Club's "Open Party" but participants arriving for the event were met by a crowd of at least 100 skinheads, nationalists and elderly religious protesters carrying Russian Orthodox icons and crosses. When the protest turned violent, police had to be called in to quell the disturbance.

The violence came only a few weeks before Moscow's Pride parade, scheduled for May 27. City authorities have promised to ban the parade, citing the public disorder that might ensue and threats from local Muslim clerics.

Nikolai Alexeyev, one of the chief organizers of the Pride parade, told the BBC that the protest was

a "mass, coordinated action aimed at intimidating Russian gays and lesbians." Scott Long, director of the LGBT rights program at Human Rights Watch, described the situation for Moscow's LGBT community as "ominous."

Until 1993, homosexual acts in Russia were punishable by up to five years in prison.

#### California Bill Seeks to Rewrite Textbooks

The California State Senate has approved a bill that would require California's social science textbooks to include the contributions of gays, lesbians, bisexuals and transgender people to the state and nation's history.

The measure passed the Senate 22-15, with no Republican voting for the measure. The bill heads to the California Assembly where opponents vow to fight the measure.

Introduced by Democratic Sen. Sheila Kuehl, the state's first openly gay legislator, the proposed law would also bar textbooks and other instructional material that portrayed gays in a negative light.

According to Equity California, which helped sponsor the legislation, two out of three gay students are verbally harassed and one in six is physically harassed.

"The invisibility that currently exists (in textbooks) contributes to that," Geoff Kors, executive director of Equality California added.

Other women senators drew parallels to the lack of female or minority role models they saw in history books as children.

Sen. Bill Morrow disputed the comparison. "If you are a black American, you can't help it, you were born that way," he said. "There is not one scintilla of credible scientific evidence that suggests that homosexuality is biological in origin..... It is behavioral; it is not racial."

Sen. Richard Alarcon disagreed. "This is the way ... God made people," said Alarcon. "Let's stop trying to hide this reality."

Republican Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger has not taken a position on the bill.

California is the United States' largest buyer of textbooks, with annual spending topping \$400 million.

# **National HIV Testing Campaign**

#### Take the Test!


National HIV Testing Day (NHTD) is June 27. The goal of NHTD is to encourage all individuals to receive education, counseling and testing for human immunodeficiency virus (HIV). The National Association of People with AIDS sponsors this health promotion event.

HIV can be spread through the sharing of needles with someone who is infected with the virus, and may be transmitted to an unborn baby from her infected mother through perinatal transmission or breast milk.

However, the most common way is through unprotected sexual contact with an infected person. During sex, HIV can enter the body through the lining of the vagina, vulva, penis, rectum, or mouth. By engaging in any form of sex, you put yourself at risk for contracting HIV. By not wearing a condom, you put yourself at an even greater risk.

In our country one million people are infected with HIV/AIDS. "In 2004, the largest estimated proportion of HIV/AIDS diagnoses were for men who have sex with men (MSM), followed by adults and adolescents infected through heterosexual contact (www.cdc.gov)."

When you have sex with someone, you have sex with all their partners as well, every sexual contact, every body fluid, every exposure. If your partner has had sex with multiple partners, your chance of contracting HIV or an STD multiplies. For instance, if you have been exposed to three primary partners, you have really been exposed to seven contacts, or seven separate body fluids. You not only need to know the status of the people you are sexually active with, known as primary partners, but also their partners, known as secondary and tertiary partners, and identified by health departments as "contacts". The number of partners you have determines the number of contacts you have, and helps you to identify your **risk exposure**. Look at the chart to determine your risk exposure by using the number of partners you have had in your

lifetime to determine your secondary, and tertiary "contacts".

With the extreme number of people infected with HIV today, more than 50 million worldwide, there is extreme importance of protection and early HIV testing. Even if you do not think you have risks, it's better to be safe than sorry. Knowing your HIV status will give you peace of mind! If the thought of being tested scares you, take a friend whom you trust. Remember, HIV testing is free and confidential at the Erie County Department of Health.

On June 27, thousands of people will be tested for HIV. Getting tested is the responsible thing to do if you are sexually active. Take the test. For more information about National HIV Testing Day you can visit www.napwa.org.
