

"What Jesus Didn't Say"

In my second year of high school my grades were remarkable. They were remarkably poor. My mother decided that I would benefit from the smaller classes and the individual tutoring of an all-male boarding school that specialized in preparing not-so-bright students for college.

The school that was chosen for me was located on a gorgeous campus with rolling hills and acres of green pastures. My mother liked it because there were compulsory chapel services, and she thought that such religious training would keep me on the straight and narrow. I liked it because there were horses and the students could take a course in horseback riding.

I don't think that my mother, or anyone else in our family for that matter, realized that the boarding school was sponsored by a very conservative fundamentalist Protestant denomination. Among the graduation requirements was a non-credit course called "evangelism". What it amounted to was that we were required to spend one afternoon a week passing out gospel tracts or pamphlets that had Bible messages about salvation on the inside.

The outside cover was usually a full-color picture of a waterfall or a forest, or some other natural scenery that would attract the attention of anyone who was willing to read it. On the cover there was often a question such as, "What Must I Do To Be Saved?" or "Are You Born Again?" Inside there would be various scripture passages that would attempt to lead the reader to salvation or, as they often said "to a saving relationship with Jesus Christ."

Being a shy teenager, I always found it hard to pass out those tracts on a busy street, in the front of the post office, or on the subway. I guess I was fearful that someone would think that I was a religious fanatic. But I also admired those who had the courage to be so up-front and honest about their beliefs.

Some years after my boarding school experience, I was at Grand Central Station in New York City. There, as I was about to board my train, a young man handed me a religious pamphlet such as I had been familiar with at school. At first, I wasn't going to take it. On second thought, I imagined that he might be some poor kid in the situation I had been in several years before. He had a whole handful of religious pamphlets to dispose of, and the least I could do was lighten his load by taking one from him.

As I reached for the narrow piece of paper, I could read the question written across the front: "All That Jesus Said About Homosexuality..." I thought, here we go again! This is going to contain some theological ramblings concerning what would be perceived as the most grievous sin imaginable.

I hesitantly opened the pamphlet. Inside there was nothing but a blank page.

"This one's blank," I yelled to the young man as my train was beginning to pull away from the station, "quick give me another one!" "They're all blank," he replied, "Jesus said nothing about homosexuality!"

I knew, of course, that he was right. The Old Testament has something to say about homosexuality, as does the Apostle Paul. But Jesus is silent on the subject. I mean, it would have been a whole lot easier for all of us if Jesus had made some kind of clear statement about homosexuality. For whatever reason, none was made.

Jesus—the one whom we, as Christians, worship as Savior and Lord. Jesus-the one who said of himself, "I am the way, the truth and the life." Jesus the one who the New Testament says is the "pioneer and the perfecter of our faith," doesn't say a word about the subject that has caused so much division and dissension in so many Christian churches.

When Harry Emerson Fosdick was the preaching minister of the great Riverside Church in New York City, he used to say, "When I get to heaven there are a number of questions I'm going to ask God." Well, when I get to heaven I have a question: "Why did Jesus not say anything about homosexuality?" I don't know the answer to that question, but whatever it is, the truth of the matter is that for all the hours of discussion and angry exchanges and emotion-filled theological controversies, the one who founded the church, Jesus himself, said nothing.





Groups Urge Help for Homeless Gay Youth

The federal government is neglecting an epidemic of homelessness among tens of thousands of gay and lesbian youth, many of whom leave home because of conflicts with their parents, two national advocacy groups have charged.

According to the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force and the National Coalition for the Homeless, gay, lesbian and transgender youth make up 20-40 percent of the total number of homeless and runaway youth.

"The national response to this epidemic has been nothing short of disgraceful," Matt Foreman, executive director of the task force said. He urged Congress to increase appropriations for the federal Runaway, Homeless and Missing Children Protection Act, which must be reauthorized next year. He added that



for the first time, funds should be targeted specifically at boosting programs to aid gay and lesbian youth.

Citing incidents of anti-gay harassment at homeless shelters, the groups urged that some shelter space be set aside for gay youth. They also recommended that any organization seeking public funding to serve homeless youth should be required to prove its staff would treat gay and lesbian young people competently and fairly.

The two groups also expressed concern that President Bush's proposal for federal funding of faithbased organizations could lead to situations where church-run shelters would discriminate against gay youths seeking services.

No Benefits for Gay Couples in Michigan

The Michigan Court of Appeals has ruled that public universities and governments can't provide health insurance to the partners of gay employees without violating the state constitution.

A three-judge panel said a 2004 voter-approved ban on gay marriage also applies to same-sex domestic partner benefits.

"The marriage amendment's plain language prohibits public employers from recognizing same-sex unions for any purpose," the court said.

The court's decision reverses a 2005 ruling from an Ingham County judge who said universities and governments could provide the benefits.

A constitutional amendment passed by Michigan voters in November 2004 made the union between a man and a woman the only arrangement recognized as a marriage "or similar union for any purpose." Those six words led to the fight over benefits for gay couples.

Miraculous "Cure" for Haggard

The Rev. Ted Haggard has been declared "completely heterosexual" after undergoing three weeks of intensive counseling, according to one of the four ministers who oversaw Haggard's "rehabilitation."

The Rev. Tim Ralph of Larkspur, CO said Haggard's sexual contact with men was limited to the former male prostitute who came forward with sexual allegations against the right-wing Christian clergyman.

"He is completely heterosexual," Ralph told the *Denver Post.* "That is something he discovered. It was the acting-out situations where things took place. It wasn't a constant thing."

Ralph added that the board's investigation supported Haggard's claim that his only extramarital sexual contact happened with Mike Jones.

"If we're going to be proved wrong, somebody else is going to come forward, and that usually happens really quickly," he said. "We're into this thing over 90 days and it hasn't happened."

Haggard resigned as president of the National Association of Evangelicals last year after allegations of sexual misconduct surfaced. He was also forced out from the 14,000 New Life Church that he founded.

Jones alleged Haggard paid him for sex and sometimes used methamphetamine when they were together. Haggard, who is married, has publicly admitted to "sexual immorality."

Snickers Super Bowl Ad Pulled

The company that makes Snickers candy bars has pulled its' Super Bowl-launched commercial showing two auto mechanics accidentally kissing while eating the same candy bar and then ripping out some chest hair to do something "manly."

The ad was benched after The Human Rights Campaign and the Gay and Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation complained that it was homophobic.

Alternative ending to the ad appeared on the web site of Masterfoods USA, a division of Mars Inc., which also makes M&M's and other candies. One alternative showed the two men attacking each other after the kiss. The Web site also featured video of players from the Super Bowl teams reacting to the kiss.

"This type of jeering from professional sports figures at the sight of two men kissing fuels the kind of anti-gay bullying that haunts countless gay and lesbian school children on playgrounds all across the country," Human Rights Campaign president Joe Solmonese said in a statement.

GLAAD spokesman Marc McCarthy said the group believed "this kind of prejudice was inexcusable."

Masterfoods spokeswoman Alice Nathanson issued a statement in which she said the company would stop running the ad on television and the web site.

"As with all of our Snickers advertising, our goal was to capture the attention of our core Snickers consumer," Nathanson wrote. "Feedback from our target consumers has been positive. In addition, many media and web site commentators of this year's Super Bowl commercial line-up ranked the commercial among this year's top 10 best. USA Today ranked it nine of its top 10 picks," she continued.

"We know that humor is highly subjective and understand that some people may have found the ad offensive. Clearly that was not our intent," Nathanson added.


Lutheran Church Removes Gay Pastor


A gay minister who announced he has a partner is being removed from the clergy by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

The Rev. Bradley Schmeling will be removed from the church's roster effective Aug. 15, according to the ELCA's disciplinary committee. Schmeling has led Atlanta's oldest Lutheran church since 2000.

The minister, who was open about his sexuality when he took the job, announced last year he had found a lifelong companion. At that time, Bishop Ronald Warren asked the 44-year-old pastor to resign, but Schmeling refused. Warren then began disciplinary proceedings against Schmeling for violating church rules barring sex outside of marriage.

Before he was chosen pastor of Atlanta's St. John's Church, Schmeling told both the bishop and the congregation about his sexual orientation. However, he didn't have a partner at that time.


