Maryland Gov. Martin O'Malley signed marriage equality bill into law March 1, 2012, and it takes effect in January 2013.

Six state governments—and the District of Columbia) have passed laws offering same-sex marriage and currently offer same-sex marriages: New York, Massachusetts, Connecticut, Iowa, Vermont, and New Hampshire. The state of Washington also legalized gay marriage in Februaru 2012; its law takes effect in June.

PA marriage ban defeated (for now)

March 13, 2012 - Today Equality PA, working in partnership and cooperation with our allies and friends at the ACLU of Pennsylvania, the Pennsylvania Diversity Network, Equality Partners of Western Pennsylvania, NEPA Rainbow Alliance, Keystone Progress, SEIU, The Pittsburgh Lesbian Correspondents, the LGBT Community Center Coalition of Central PA, EQPA's Student Network Across Pennsylvania (SNAP), the Gay and Lesbian Executive Committee (GLEC), Philadelphia Family PRIDE, the Gay and Lesbian Taskforce, the Human Rights Campaign, Delaware Valley Americans United, Working America, Erie Gay News, Philadelphia Gay News and bloggers Sue Kerr, Tom Waters and Lauren Daley...

...succeeded in having House Bill 1434, the mean-spirited and nonsensical constitutional amendment on same-sex marriage, pulled from the agenda for consideration by the House State Government Committee.

HB 1434 was on its way for a vote and we worked tirelessly to make sure that never happened.

What is your stance on legislation, such as the Employment Non Discrimination Act (ENDA), which would prohibit discrimination against employees on the basis of sexual orientation or gender identity for civilian nonreligious employers with over 15 employees? Bob Casey (D-Incumbent)

I am an original cosponsor of the Employment Non-Discrimination Act in the Senate.

Joseph Vodvarka (D)

Any American who wants to work should be able to do so with out worrying about being discriminated against.

If they are good workers they should be protected.

Marc Scaringi (R)

I oppose ENDA because pursuant to Article 1 Section 8 of the U.S. Constitution the federal government lacks the authority to legislate in the area of employer/employee relations. Accordingly, pursuant to the 10th Amendment to the Constitution, the power to legislate in the area of employer/employee relations is reserved to the states.

Bob Casey (D-Incumbent)

While in the Senate I have worked with the LGBT community for equal rights. I have a 100% voting record with the Human Rights Campaign. I

was a cosponsor of and voted for the Don't Ask, Don't Tell Repeal Act that was signed into law and ensures that any qualified American willing to risk his or her life for our country will be permitted to serve free of discriminatory treatment. To fight bullying in schools, I introduced the Safe Schools Improvement Act to require school districts that receive federal funding to adopt codes of conduct that specifically prohibit bullying and harassment based on a student's actual or perceived sexual orientation or gender identity. To crack down on hate crimes, I was an original cosponsor of the Matthew Shepard Hate Crimes Prevention Act that was signed into law. This law imposes criminal penalties for causing (or attempting to cause) bodily injury because of the actual or perceived race, color, religion, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, or disability of such person. I have also adopted a policy in my Senate offices barring discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity.

Joseph Vodvarka (D)

I'd like to see us work for a cure for AIDS and cancer. Look at how much we've spent on these wars, what if we spent it on a cure for AIDS and cancer?

Stacey Gray (I)

I fully support all anti-discrimination legislation. I have been actively advocating for ENDA for many years, for Pennsylvania's HB 300 since it was first introduced in 2009 and local nondiscrimination ordinances as well. It is my opinion that like race, color, religious creed, ancestry, age, national origin or handicap, people must be judged strictly upon their capacity to perform the job, to be a responsible tenant or qualified customer, that their private and personal lives must not be permitted to be the basis for discrimination of any type, not in the workplace, not in housing nor in public accommodation.

Ted Malanowski (I)

I believe the ENDA legislation is long overdue to become 'Law-of-the-Land' in the United States. I find it troubling we are having this discussion on GLBL rights in America. In our U.S. Constitution, the preamble starts with these seven words, "We the People of the United States". It doesn't start with 'We the People of the United States who are NOT Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Transgender'. We in America, must put our phobias aside and become the United and Inclusionary Nation millions of American Military Personnel (including Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual) have given their lives to protect.
