HIV Counseling and Testing is available free of charge through your Erie County Department of Health, 606 W 2nd St, on a walk-in basis. For your comfort and to accommodate specific needs, other sites are available:

HIV counseling and testing is also offered on an outreach basis. Please call 451-6727 for information. If you choose not to have the standardized blood test done, an oral antibody test known as *ORASURE* is now available for HIV testing. A small pad is placed between your cheek and gum for two minutes, the test measures the amount of interstitial fluid found in that area.

More than 34 million people are now infected with HIV/AIDS in the world today. Most of them live in countries where testing is not an option. *Exercise your right to know.* If you have reason to suspect you might have been exposed to HIV, find out today for your own peace of mind. Get tested!

# Whetstine convicted

Roy Whetstine Jr. was convicted on November 10, 1999 on 6 counts of theft by deception as a result of the "Cruise for Life" AIDS fundraiser he had scheduled for September 19, 1998.

The prosecution alleged that in June of 1998, Whetstine went to the Victorian Princess Cruise Line claiming that he wished to charter a boat to be used as a fundraiser for the HIV/AIDS Outreach Ministry of St. Paul's Episcopal and the St. Martin's Center HIV Support Group. It should be stressed that the two AIDS charities have always and continue to do worthy work in the community. The Victorian Princess Cruise Line was also very gracious and pleasant when dealt with by the community about this incident.

Whetstine signed a contract, but did not make a down payment. The representative from Victorian Princess made a notation by the signature stating that Roy would return the next day with a check for the down payment. He never returned with payment nor contacted

Victorian Princess again. He attempted to get the two groups to pay for the down payment. He allegedly showed them a copy contract that did not have the notation about returning with a check.

Whetstine sold some tickets locally through Scapers, a gay gift shop that has since closed, and also directly to some individuals. He told several of those who purchased tickets locally that almost all the tickets were sold out. Whetstine claimed that tickets had also been sold in Cleveland, Pittsburgh and Buffalo. It is not known exactly how many tickets totally may have been sold, but it may have been a small number.

On Thursday, September 17, two days before the cruise was supposed to have taken place, it was determined that the cruise would not be taking place when a local woman became suspicious and Victorian Princess was contacted. Area gay and mainstream media were contacted that the cruise was not going to be taking place with no reason given.

The next day, Friday, September 18, Whetstine was found to be staying at an area campground. Although he claimed that the incident was an oversight and that he would return to straighten the matter out, he did not show up at the dock the next day. Several community members and a representative from the Victorian Princess Cruise Line were at the dock when the cruise was scheduled to take place to explain the situation to anyone who might have bought tickets, but no other ticket holders showed up.

Whetstine did not apparently make an effort to contact anyone until the spring of 1999. He did not contact any of the witnesses in the trial to refund money, nor has he given the money to the original intended support groups.

Whetstine has previously been convicted and served time for fraud and theft by deception. He was on parole at the time of the cruise. Sentencing will be on Wednesday, January 5, 2000 at 9 AM in Judge Shad Connelly's courtroom at the Erie County Courthouse.

Hopefully, another group will come along and start anew. In the meantime, stay tuned on the web site that Mike intends to keep up.

I would ask that you don't take for granted all the progress that our community has made over the past several years. After moving here to small town Pennsylvania, I feel like I have stepped back 15 or 20 years. I have come to profoundly appreciate how far we have progressed in the Erie area.

If you don't have access to the Internet, you'll need to find a print alternative. For national news there's the

**Advocate** (in my opinion the most informative), **Out**, **Curve** (very hip), **Hero**, **A&U** (HIV-Positive), **GIRLFRIENDS**,... and a slew of others that you can find at almost any bookstore or newsstand.

Perhaps more important is to keep an eye on newspapers from neighboring areas. **The Gay People's Chronicle** is indispensable if you want to keep track of stuff that's going on in Cleveland-Akron, as well as Columbus and most of eastern Ohio. It's always available at the bars. So is **Pittsburgh's Out** if you're looking for info on that city.

## Theatre

In town, there's the **Roadhouse Theatre** at 145 W 11th (814)453-5658, [www.erie.net/~roadhouse](http://www.erie.net/~roadhouse), and **Directors Circle** at 652 W 16th (814) 451-0036 both of which have made a point of selecting LGBT themed plays for past seasons, especially Directors Circle. Look through the *Erie Daily Times'* **Showcase** periodically because they've been very good about advertising all local plays including those with gay content.

**Buffalo United Artists**, 884 Main (716) 886-9239 has a strong history of showing gay themed plays. By the way, this December 10-19th they will be re-showing **Paul Rudnick's** hilarious **The Most Fabulous Story Ever Told**, and January 14th they will be opening the uplifting **Beautiful Thing**. Go. Both are must sees. **Pittsburgh's City Theatre**, 57 S 13th (412) 431-2489 is very supportive and often hosts shows for HIV/AIDS benefits. **Dobama Theatre** at (216)932-6838, <http://multiverse.com/~dobama/> and **Cleveland Public Theatre** at (216) 631-2727, [www.clevelandartists.net/cpt/](http://www.clevelandartists.net/cpt/) are good bets in Cleveland.

## TV, film and video

Of course, it's a good idea to browse any of the releasing companies for gay movies mentioned in these pages, too. If you KNOW the title you're looking for, but have no idea where to find it, try [www.reel.com](http://www.reel.com), they are to video what [www.amazon.com](http://www.amazon.com) is to books. Your other option is to browse [www.onvideo.org](http://www.onvideo.org) which is a general clearing house of info on the what, where and when of video releases.

When it comes to LGBT films now playing or about to be released to first run at movie theaters, [www.planetout.com/pno/kiosk/popcornq/](http://www.planetout.com/pno/kiosk/popcornq/) is an excellent resource, except it will probably whet your appetite for cool flicks that may NEVER come to Erie. I've had good luck finding limited release stuff playing at **Cleveland's Cedar Lee Theatre** (440) 717-4696, [www.cedarlee.com](http://www.cedarlee.com). Otherwise you'll just have to hope for the flick to hit Tinseltown or one of the discount theatres perhaps weeks later.

The **Gay and Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation** has a good listing of things of gay interest on the boob tube every week if you browse their homepage [www.glaad.org](http://www.glaad.org) and look for their "**Hollywood Hotsheet**" and "**TV Scoreboard**." If you want to see your favorite queer musician on the small screen then [www.rockontv.com](http://www.rockontv.com) is the place to look.


