

20th Anniversary Family Portrait to be taken at Pride Fest on Aug. 29

It's hard to believe, but 2015 marks the 20th anniversary of the first-ever LGBT Family Portrait. To celebrate this milestone, everyone is invited to be in the Family Portrait that will be taken at the start of Pride Fest on Saturday, August 29 in Griswold Park, 150 W 14th St, Erie PA. The day will begin with assembling beginning at noon for the Pride Parade from the Zone Dance Club, 133 W 18th S, and step off at 1 PM. The parade will end up in Griswold Park. As we arrive in Griswold, anyone who wants to be in the Family Portrait should gather in front of and facing the stage. A photographer will take the Family Portrait from the stage, and that will then kick off Pride Fest at 2 PM.

The first-ever Family Portrait was taken on the steps of the Erie County Courthouse, 140 W 6th St, on Saturday, October 28, 1995. This was taken to be in the City of Erie's Bicentennial Time Capsule and is now included in the Bicentennial Time Capsule at Dobbins Landing, due to be opened in 2095. We want to especially invite anyone in the original photo, and we also want to encourage as many other groups and individuals as possible, to show the growth of the local LGBT community.

his church's probing into his sexuality. But when he meets a group of destitute, orphaned teenagers, he becomes obsessed with a mission that will change his and their lives forever. Fresh off a workshop at Disney hosted by music theatre legend Steven Schwartz, the score from this two-time winner of the Richard Rogers Award for Musical Theater will come alive in Erie for one night only. *Invisible Thread* is the story of a man battling to find his place in a world full of injustice as he asks "is changing the world even possible?"

At the event, GEAE Board President, Will Koehler, presented GEAE's 5-year vision to work with local allies in order to increase Erie's Municipal Equality Index (MEI) from its current rating of 57/100 to 100/100 by 2020 (Human Rights Campaign, 2014). His address highlighted the first phase of this vision which is to conduct a multi-phase LGBT community needs assessment. This assessment includes working with NWPA Pride Alliance to form a community roundtable discussion group and working with Edinboro University's Social Work Department to conduct a needs assessment survey. Over 80 people participated in the Afternoon including State Representative Ryan Bizzaro, City Council Member Bob Merski, and founding Board member, Bob Howden. We are grateful to this year's Hosts, Friends, Partners, and Equality Advocates that enabled us to raise over \$10,000 towards our efforts to improve Erie's MEI! We look forward to working with these resources to complete our needs assessment, offer quality educational programing such as the 2nd Biennial Intersections of Equality on November 7th, and other service opportunities and social events throughout the remainder of 2015 and beyond. Much of what we know about trans people in the U.S. has come from this study, and it has been an important source of information about who we are for advocates, policy makers, and the public.

But first and foremost, the 2015 U.S. Trans Survey is our community's survey. It is a survey for all trans identities, including trans, genderqueer, and non-binary people. It is for us, about us, and by us. As the community's survey, the 2015 U.S. Trans Survey data set and results will be available to community advocates, organizations, and researchers for years to come.







TransFamily of Erie is expanding

No matter what your feelings are on Caitlyn Jenner, there is no disputing that she is having a very positive impact on our community. She may not know all the right things to say yet, but she is working hard on learning. No one can ask for more than that. Aside from Chaz Bono, she is by far the most high profile person ever to come out as transgender, and she is challenging a lot of people's thinking on what it means to be male or female.

Locally, her coming out is making a difference. Since her appearance on ABC with Diane Sawyer, and the resulting local media attention, TransFamily of Erie has doubled in size. Most interesting is the explosion of attendance by trans youth, as well as people from the more rural areas of NW PA. Launched in February 2013, TransFamily started with about eight people, many of whom were already out and part of the Erie Sisters and Brothers. Since then, our group has grown to roughly 60 attendees, with our largest single attendance of 36 in June! Our attendees come from all over northwest PA and northeast OH.

While this growth has been an unexpected and encouraging development, it has also presented challenges that we have not faced before. Managing a group of this size can be daunting, but we are working on ways to make it more beneficial to everyone who attends, such as splitting up into breakout sessions when attendance warrants it. Another way we are working to manage growth is by creating satellite groups in outlying areas to assist people who cannot travel to Erie.

With that in mind, we are happy to announce that beginning in October, we will be holding monthly meetings in Meadville, PA. Meetings will be held on



thesecond Saturday of each month from 2-5pm on the second floor of Counseling Corner, which is located at 898 Park Avenue in Meadville. The first meeting will occur on October 10. For more information, please contact Richelle Koehler at richellekoehler@ hotmail.com.

In addition, to better serve the transgender youth in our area, we are starting another group called Trans-Family Youth. The group will provide a safe space for local transgender, non-binary, and gender fluid youth, as well as their allies to discuss their challenges and work on building self-awareness and the confidence to live as their authentic selves. Addressing needs of LGBT seniors

With the aging of the baby boomers, nearly 80 million Americans born between 1946 and 1965 will need some types of service in their senior years. Of these 80 million approximately 2.4 million to 8 million are LGBT approaching the retirement age (*Source:* Senior Action in a Gay Environment).

We need to be sure that we here in our LGBT community in Erie (and the tri-state area) are taking care of our own senior gay community. We need to look at all the possibilities for aging in place and allowing the senior to remain in their home or in a "comfortable and acceptable" senior community. We need to hire agencies, caregivers and patronize senior communities that understand the LBGT community and accept and embrace our uniqueness. We need to support political leaders who respect and acknowledge our community and we need to abide by the mission of one or our local senior organizations, The Independent Council on Aging, Inc (ICA). The ICA's mission statement is very simple and concise: "to improve the quality of life for mature adults, while fostering a positive image of aging".

To me, it is quite amazing that locally we have done so little for seniors to have a place that they can afford that offers them respect and safety. Although anti-discrimination laws prohibit gay-only housing and hiring, some buildings (senior living communities) can be made LGBT-friendly through marketing and location. Providers need to do the same for in-home care aides. They need to hire and train aides who live and function within their/own culture and communities. We need to remember that most of these gay seniors are birthed out of the baby boomer era, and make up

all of the seniors who blazed a trail for gay rights.

Working in the elder care business, I see that many of our caregivers are uneducated about LGBT senior needs. Few acknowledge and overtly hire members of the LBGT community to care for LGBT seniors. Few, if any, advertise that they understand the needs of "all seniors" and have the qualified, educated caregivers on hand to help. I know of none that offer diversity training that includes LGBT. "We know that caregivers are uneducated about LGBT senior needs, " says Rod Hensel, s Buffalo area gay activist who helped to organize the Silver Pride Project. "And consequently we know that after sacrificing so much to come out, LGBT seniors feel the need to go back in the closet in their last days to avoid the discrimination and mistreatment they fought all their lives." More of our senior care community in the area need to start coming out and supporting the LGBT consumer by learning their culture and understanding the fears, desires and needs of the entire elderly population. They need to hire LGBT caregivers and match them to the appropriate senior. Having a caregiver who understands you, your lifestyle and your culture is paramount in a healthy, happy, and loving end of life experience. The agencies need to advertise and market "culture diversity".

The LGBT member needs to practice due diligence as well in choosing and seeking out providers, caregivers and agencies who understand them. They need to be pro-active in directing their own care, ask questions and ask for exactly what they expect of their caregiver and of the agencies that they hire.

Take a look online for agencies and organizations that cater to the senior community. Call, ask questions, and don't be afraid to express your needs and desires.




