ECHTF Walks for HIV Awareness

On Monday September 27, 2021, the Erie County HIV Task Force held the 4th Annual HIV / AIDS Awareness Walk at Frontier Park, Erie PA. The ECHTF is a collaboration of local organizations and individuals dedicated to educating, supporting, and advocating for people living with HIV/AIDS and preventing the spread of infection. With the COVID-19 pandemic last year, testing and treatment services were limited for HIV and STIs across the nation as well as Erie County. In 2021, significant increases have been reported in HIV / AIDS and STI cases overall. Communicable diseases including HIV/STIs are preventable with education and access to medications, prophylactics, and services. The HIV / AIDS walk provides a reminder to the local community that making personal health a priority is everyone's right. This year's awareness walk also welcomed the recent addition of Central Outreach Wellness Center of Erie as local health center for the LGBTOIA community. Central Outreach supplied participants with free walk t-shirts and testing opportunities via their

mobile unit at the event. Awareness walk attendees also received complimentary gift bags of materials from the task force as well as event sponsors Adagio Health, SafeNet, Community HealthNet, the Erie County Department of Health, Erie Gay News, and the Northwest Pennsylvania Pride Alliance. Public Health Staff were on hand for participants to ask questions and receive additional information regarding COVID-19, and the services of Nicotine Free Northwest PA and Adagio Health.



Dr. Rachel Levine sworn in as fourstar admiral

Dr. Rachel Levine once again made history becoming the first openly transgender four-star officer in any of the country's eight uniformed services.

Tuesday, October 19th, she was ceremoniously sworn in as an admiral - the highest ranking official in the U.S Public Health Service Commissioned Corps. This also made her the first female admiral in the Corps history.

In response to becoming a four-star officer, Levine said, "This is a momentous occasion, and I am both humbled and pleased to take this role for the impact I can make, and for the historic nature of what it symbolizes. May this appointment be the first of many like it as we create a more inclusive future."

Chautauqua Institution's Gene Robinson Is Retiring



Chautauqua Institution has announced the retirement of the Rt. Rev. V. Gene Robinson as Vice President of Religion and Senior Pastor, effective Dec. 31.

Robinson joined the Institution staff in 2017, following a career in Episcopal Church leadership that culminated with service as bishop of the Diocese of New Hampshire. Robinson is an outspoken advocate for the rights of marginalized populations, recognized for his groundbreaking work with the LGBTQ community, youth communities and those suffering from abuse and addiction.

Prior to Chautauqua, Robinson was elected Episcopal Bishop of New Hampshire on June 7, 2003, becoming the first openly gay and partnered priest to be elected Bishop in historic Christendom. He served as IX Bishop of New Hampshire until his retirement in early 2013. His ministry has focused on helping congregations and clergy, especially in times of conflict, utilizing his skills in congregational





dynamics, conflict resolution and mediation. He is the author of In the Eye of the Storm: Swept to the Center by God (Morehouse, 2006) and God Believes in Love: Straight Talk about Gay Marriage (Knopf, 2012). In addition to being a popular speaker in the U.S. and abroad, he has written opinion columns on a variety of topics for The Daily Beast, Huffington Post and Time.com.

In 2009, Barack Obama invited Robinson to pray the invocation at the opening Inaugural Ceremonies and Concert at the Lincoln Memorial. In 2018, he had the honor of presiding over the interment of Matthew Shepard at the Washington National Cathedral.

Mount Calvary Lutheran Church becomes first Reconciling In Christ Community in Erie County.

The congregation of Mount Calvary Lutheran Church (1603 W 32nd St. in Erie, PA.) voted on July 18, 2021 to become a Reconciling In Christ (RIC) community. The vote was a culmination of a multiyear long journey involving training, education, and dialogue led by Pastor Kristen Papson, Congregational Council, and volunteers from congregation. Our welcoming statement reads:

"In Christ's body, there is a place for you. We invite and welcome you to join us, no matter your social status, race, gender expression or identity, sexual orientation, socioeconomic position, physical and mental abilities, or where you are in your faith journey. We are committed to the work of racial equity, bringing justice for God's beloveds. You are accepted and affirmed just as you are - with all your differences and all of your gifts - a unique child of God. Galatians 3:28 says, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male and female, for all of you are one in Christ Jesus".

Our journey started by reaching out to ReconcilingWorks, Lutherans For Full Participation, who has advocated for the full welcome, inclusion, and equity of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, and asexual/aromantic Lutherans in all aspects of the life of their Church, congregation, and community since 1974. ReconcilingWorks has a vision to keep expanding the welcome, liberating those who are forced to live in to margins, to keep dismantling barriers and building bridges, and to keep working until all of God's beloved have equity. Their core values are rooted in the belief that God values and embraces each person as a beloved child, that the Spirit gives a diversity of gifts for the common good, and that Jesus Christ calls us to work for justice. Several Mount Calvary Congregational Council members attended Building an Inclusive Church (BIC) training that was designed to equip participants with ways to create dialogue and deepen relationships throughout their faith community while on their journey towards the public and intentional welcoming of people of

all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions. As part of Mount Calvary's journey we also hosted a Building an Inclusive Church (BIC) training, which was attended by other members of our RIC committee, as well as participants from other faith communities in the tristate area.

Following our training, our RIC committee members (including Pastor Kristen Papson) began having a dialogue with church members via a process called "graceful engagement", as well as having LGBTQIA+ oriented topics via our monthly newsletter, during adult Sunday School, and during weekly sermons. Committee members also drafted our Welcoming Statement, participated in Erie's Pride Parade in 2019, and the "Drive Your Pride" event held at Presque Isle in 2020. Covid-19 restrictions and shutdowns slowed our progress but finally, on July 18, 2021 during our semi-annual Congregational meeting, we voted to formally adopt our Welcoming Statement and to be identified as an RIC community (now listed on the ReconcilingWorks website). When we began our journey there was not an RIC community within 100 miles. Since then, we have seen the formation of RIC communities in Buffalo NY, Cleveland OH, and as close as Wexford and Warren, PA. We are proud and honored to be the first and only RIC community in Erie County and the City of Erie, PA.

As part of journey to becoming an RIC community we have made public commitments that we will:

1. Explicitly state a welcome to LGBTQIA+ people and a commitment of racial equality in our Welcoming Statement.

2. Be open to calling an LGBTQIA+ and Black, Brown, Indigenous, Person of Color Rostered Leader.

3. Allow community space/sanctuary to be used for LGBTQIA+ weddings and blessings

Our RIC logo, designed by ReconcilingWorks, was inspired by the Progressive Pride Flag design, and includes rainbow colors, as well as blue, pink, and white to represent our transgender siblings, and black and brown to represent the fullness that the People of Color bring to the queer community.

Mount Calvary Lutheran currently offers in person church service every Sunday at 9:30am. We offer both inside and parking lot service options. Parking lot worshippers remain in their vehicle and can hear service by tuning to designated radio station, and will have communion delivered to their vehicle. We also stream Sunday service live on Facebook and post it on YouTube. You do not need to be Lutheran to attend. Church office hours are Monday-Friday 9am-1pm and our phone number is 814-864-6831. We invite to join us on Sundays for worship, and to stop by or call during office hours and meet Pastor Kristen and Jenna, who runs our front office.


