Ace Week 2022, October 23 - 29

Ace Week, formerly known as Asexual Awareness Week, was founded in 2010. This International movement began as an awareness campaign to encourage LGBTQ+ communities to support the ace community. The community uses the word ace to encompass anyone who fits within the spectrum of asexuality. An asexual person experiences little to no sexual attraction and/or sexual desire.

Ace Week was founded by Sara Beth Brooks and Asexual Visibility Education Network founder David Jay. They wanted to gain the attention of some major organizations such as the National LGBTQ Task Force and the UN Human Relations Counsel.

The very first Ace Week was mostly conducted online through social media activities and blogging. In an effort to increase ace awareness within the LGBTQ+ community, members of the ace community created "Dear LGBTQ Community" videos. These were posted on Twitter, Facebook, and YouTube. Aces were also encouraged to share information and experiences on social media.

Each year has taken on its own unique flavor, but spreading educational materials, organizing community events, and discussing ace experiences have always remained at its core.

Department of Aging: Registration Now Open for the Virtual LGBTQ Aging Summit and Institute on HIV and Aging on October 6 and 7

Harrisburg, PA - September 13, 2022 – The Pennsylvania Department of Aging today announced registration is now open for its virtual LGBTQ Aging Summit and Institute on HIV and Aging, which will take place Thursday, October 6 and Friday, October 7. All LGBTQ older adults, stakeholders, aging service providers, advocates and allies are encouraged to attend.

The first statewide Pennsylvania LGBTQ Aging Summit, convened in 2018, drew more than 300 participants from across the commonwealth to raise awareness and mobilize collaborative efforts. Since that historic event, the department and the Pennsylvania Commission on LGBTQ Affairs have continued to work on issues raised by community advocates, Area Agencies on Aging staff, providers, and other stakeholders. The department anticipates even larger attendance for this year's summit.

"The LGBTQ Aging Summit is a great opportunity to highlight the department's ongoing commitment to building more inclusive, age-friendly communities for LGBTQ older adults. The summit is offering tools for LGBTQ older adults to live happy, healthy lives and for allies and service providers to learn how to further support LGBTQ communities," said Secretary of Aging Robert Torres. "I encourage everyone to register for this informative summit. I would like to thank our LGBTQ-affiliated partners for their continuous support in helping the department provide supportive and affirming services for LGBTQ older adults."

Day one of the virtual summit will include a keynote speech by Michael Adams, CEO of SAGE (Advocacy and Services for LGBT Elders), an overview of the Pennsylvania LGBTQ Health Needs Assessment Results, a panel discussion on elder



equity, and working sessions with two separate tracks concentrating on supporting LGBTQ older adults and on community issues. The second day will focus on aging and living with HIV and include a panel of speakers who will discuss their experiences with growing older and living with HIV, research trends in HIV and aging and the legal landscape of HIV in the commonwealth.

The department partnered with the following organizations to plan this year's summit: The Pennsylvania Commission on LGBTQ Affairs, Pennsylvania Department of Health's Office of Health Equity, the Pennsylvania Association of Area Agencies on Aging, SAGE, AARP Pennsylvania, CARIE, LeadingAge PA, Alzheimer's Association of Pennsylvania, the Elder Initiative at William Way LGBT Community Center, Persad Center, LGBT Center of Central PA, LGBT Center of Greater Reading, Bradbury Sullivan LGBT Center, Montgomery County Office of Senior Services, Southwestern PA Area Agency on Aging, and Union-Snyder Area Agency on Aging.

"The 2018 LGBTQ Aging Summit built tremendous momentum for LGBTQ aging issues in the commonwealth, and it's been amazing to see the progress made over the past four years to improve services for our LGBTQ communities as we age," said Heshie Zinman, co-founder of the LGBT Elder Initiative. "We are excited for the 2022 Summit and HIV & Aging Institute as opportunities to reconvene aging services providers and LGBTQ older Pennsylvanians to share ideas and resources that will help us to thrive as we grow older."

In June, the LGBT Elder Initiative at William Way honored the department with its Founders' Award for LGBTQ Health Equity for its efforts to support LGBTQ older adults.

These efforts included completing several projects such as including the collection of sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI) data to help guide planning, programming, and outreach to ensure aging services are inclusive and responsive, as well as launching the HIV/AIDS education and resource page for older adults on the department's website.

When asked about whether his family is accepting of him, Chole said, "Thankfully, unlike many members in the LGBTQ+ community, my family was exceptionally supportive of my sexuality."

Chole's education and social awareness led to his activism in 2018. His mother and two LGBTQ+ sons worked with Glenn Tuttle to organize the first Pride event thrown in Crawford County. Four years later, Chole serves as a Junior Board member of Crawford County Pride. Chole concluded, "Thanks to such generous scholarships and grants, such as that provided by the Pennsylvania Equality Project, I have enrolled and, at the time of writing, completed my first week of college at Penn West Edinboro."

Intersex Awareness Day on October 26

The annual Intersex Awareness Day will be celebrated on Wednesday, October 26. This is the date back in 1996 when the first public demonstration of intersex people took place in Boston, MA at the annual conference of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

At that time, the now defunct Intersex Society of North America and their allies demonstrated and shared their pains denouncing non-consensual infant genital surgery, and demanding the medical industries to take notice. Sadly, doctors dismissed the activities as a vocal minority in a New York Times article the following year.

Intersex Awareness Day highlights the fact that intersex people face violence, discrimination, stigma, harassment and persecution on account of their characteristics, which do not fit the binary notion of typical male or female bodies. Further, we are reminded that all people everywhere are created equal and should be afforded equal dignity and respect regardless of their sex characteristics.

August 12, 2022 - Recently, Tamaqua Area School District in Tamaqua, PA had a citizen at their June school board meeting complain about a transgender student being allowed to use the restroom corresponding to their gender identity. The resident was allowed by the school board to insult the child and attack the minor before telling the school board they shouldn't allow the transgender girl to use the restroom in school according to his religious beliefs.

A similar action happened in Minersville School District in Minersville, PA where their elementary school principal banned a transgender girl from using the restroom and said Minersville "wasn't ready" to have a trans student.

That's where Powered By Rainbows stepped in. We believe schools can do better and need to do better because the lives of their students are at risk if they don't. We have watched for years as school boards have been presented with parents or residents who spew hatred and make false claims about LGBTQ people. more LGBTQ affirming to their students.

We just published this new platform called "LGBTQ Friendly Classroom" which is structured under the Danielson Framework so educators can learn all about the LGBTQ community, learn the science of how valid being gay or transgender are, and learn how to help their students come out of the closet if they see the signs of a student being LGBTQ.

We included lessons for teachers so they can learn how to implement LGBTQ discussions in every subject from history, to math and economics, to litera-



ture and more. We also included a complete guide on how to handle situations from other staff members or students using slurs, helping a student with a homophobic or transphobic family at home, helping students overcome depression, students changing their name or pronouns to better fit their gender identity, and even helping them with contriversial issues like a transgender student on a sporting team.

In all of these resources, we help teachers not only understand the data but the federal laws regulating their actions. Plus, we even enable teachers to be certified as LGBTQ-Friendly Teachers and utilize the certification towards their continuing education credits.

Studies show, by utilizing a platform like our LGBTQ Friendly Classroom, schools can reduce the rate of bullying in their school, they can improve their overal GPA of students, and they can reduce the rate of depression, self-harm, and suicide among students.
