Compton's Table's mission is to eliminate systemic inequity, create community through peer connection, and empower queer youth and young adults to be agents of change. Together with the individuals and communities we serve, Compton's Table works to create a thriving queer community.

Programs and Services

Compton's Table is proud to be offering AF-FIRM, an evidence-based queer youth support group, as a free resource available to youth and young adults. In addition, we have launched Compton's Closet in two locations. This free resource provides genderaffirming attire, accessories, and hygiene products. Compton's is excited to open a community room at PACA to offer social groups and events to strengthen connection and supports. All these programs are aimed at building resilience and reducing suicide among queer youth.

Greater Erie Alliance for Equality (GEAE) Mission

The Greater Erie Alliance for Equality, Inc. GEAE works with the PA Thrive Partnership to provide testing, prevention, and support to LGBT+ persons throughout Erie County.

GEAE holds Afternoon for Equality to educate and raise funding.

GEAE holds a family-friendly After-Pride Party and helps support Erie Pride.

NW PA Pride Alliance

Mission

NWPA Pride's mission is to increase visibility for the Queer community in Northwestern Pennsylvania.

Programs and Services

Officially incorporated in 2012, NWPA Pride Alliance become the organizing body for Pride events in the city of Erie and Crawford County. Pride events have been celebrated in Erie for 30 years and NWPA Pride works to host events, gatherings, and programs to improve the visibility of the queer community in the NW PA region.

Since the official incorporation of NWPA Pride Alliance and our incorporation as a 501(c)(3), the organization has continued to grow. We now hold over 35 events every year! NWPA Pride relies on the support of partners within the Erie community to make these events a reality and is proud to offer events that are completely free to attend.

Pennsylvania Equality Project, Inc. Mission

The PA Equality Project serves the LGBTQ+ community across Pennsylvania by providing educational initiatives in pursuit of affirming our civil rights. We seek an end to discrimination, conversion therapy, and youth homelessness within the LGBTQ+ community.

We are working to open a community resource center and drop in safe space shelter in Meadville, that will serve all of northwest Pennsylvania, especially Erie County.

Read-In Protest at Blasco Public Library on June 26

The Pennsylvania Equality Project held a Read-In at the Blasco Memorial Library in Erie, PA, between 5:30 and 7:00 PM, on Monday, June 26, 2023. The Read-In protested the library's decision to remove the LGBTO+ Pride Month display along with all other displays from the children's section. Participants were advised at the Erie Pride Festival on Saturday, June 24, to make signs showing their support for the Pride display and keep them visible while at the library. At 5:30, 150 people read books silently while sitting in various seats in the library. Savannah Jakubowski, Pennsylvania Equality Project's newest Board Member, ran the event and was quite pleased with the turnout. She said, "The goal of the Read-In is to have the displays restored and not removed in future years and to raise awareness for the LGBTQ+ community of the Greater Erie area."

Moxi Hair Salon

For a safer place to find hair care, visit Moxi's Hair Salon. Owner Sara McMillan began doing hair in 2008 with no intentions of ever having her own salon. In 2013 she took time off when her daughter was born and, probably due to sleep deprivation, decided she would open her own salon, one that was environmentally friendly and cruelty-free - no products that used animal testing. Her first salon was a one-room space, and she worked alone. She has since

grown the business to 2 locations and ten employees. About four years ago, she opened one of her current locations at 1722 West 8th Street, and last August, she opened a second location at 1335 West 38th Street.

In 2016 she made all services gender-free. It didn't make sense to her that women with short hair were paying more for a haircut than men with long hair just because of their identity. With few exceptions, most customers were appreciative of this change. She describes her salons as a safer place for everyone. They accept everyone and assume nothing, for example, asking for pronouns. They welcome everyone except the intolerant.

They have joined the Dress Code Project, a global alliance of salons/shops committed to providing positive, gender-affirming services for LG-BTQ2S+ clients; and Strands for Trans, a worldwide network of hair, beauty, and wellness industries and organizations that seek to create and inspire safe and positive experiences for all guests, especially guests from the trans community. They have been active in the community, including support of Compton's Table, a table at Pride Fest, and plans for gender-free haircuts for students returning to school for 2023. Warren County Pride on June 17

Approximately 4,000 people participated in the fourth annual Warren County Pride Day at Betts Park on Saturday, June 17th. EmCee Logan Johnson and Erie DJ Sabine kept things moving with music, contests, games, and guest speakers. The American Foundation for Suicide Prevention won the "Best Decorated Booth" contest, The North PA Ghost-busters won first place in the "Best People Costume" and Thunder, a tiny Chihuahua, retained his title of "Best Pet Costume" for the fourth consecutive year. Members of the Enchanted Mountains Roller Derby presented a skating demonstration.

Attendee Michael Mahler, editor, Erie Gay News, said, "It was heartwarming and uplifting to have seen so many families enjoying a friendly day of fun in Betts Park. Having been involved with the Erie region's LGBTQ community for over 30 years, it means a lot that people in areas outside of the traditional large urban areas are free to celebrate their joy as a part of the greater community and be with friends and family."

An American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) representative spoke about the ACLU's work with law and policymakers to ensure necessary statutes exist to protect civil rights, including the rights of the LGBTQ+ community.

Over ninety regional vendors and agencies participated. PAWS Along the River brought adoptable dogs: one of those lucky dogs received an adoption application at the event. Vendor Jen Wise said, "Compared to previous years, there were more attendees from a very broad range of ages." Volunteer Cindy Thurston said, "The number of attendees and vendors was beyond my expectations."

Performers represented the New York & Pennsylvania regions: Dahlia Black and Willa De-Whisp from Buffalo, XNX and Krispy Kreme from Pittsburgh, Parker Black from Jamestown, and Miss Jessica Rabbit, Kimzie PinchWhistle, and Mister E from Warren area came together to perform all-ages music and dance sets. Two individuals, Miss Jessica Rabbit and Mister E were crowned 2023 Warren Pride Queen and King, respectively. Mister E, commented, "Warren Pride allows all of us who are in the LG-BTQ+ community to have a place to celebrate who we are, to feel safe, be heard and be seen. It's a time of togetherness, love, and acceptance."

Pittsburgh-area performer XNX said, It was

my first pride performing as a drag king which was truly incredible. I'm so thankful because I met so many amazing people and inspired so many people to be themselves."

"Warren Pride first reached out to me last year. I've been doing drag for five years but that was the first time I'd ever been reached to about performing. Coming back this year I had a vision and I had been counting down the days to bring my ability to expand and bring flow arts into my drag and show people the beauty of performance art. I wanted to represent the trans community, the drag kings, the flow artists. And I was able to do that."

Pride Month is celebrated annually in June to honor the 1969 Stonewall Inn Uprising in Manhattan, New York. The United States Census Bureau's 2021 data reports that 127,544,730 same-sex households exist within the USA.

Next year's Warren County Pride Day will be held Saturday June 15th, 2024 at Betts Park. Warren County Pride Day is meant to be an inclusive, all-ages event celebrating diversity and promoting equality, acceptance, and tolerance throughout Warren County, Pennsylvania. Warren County Pride Day celebrates and supports the regional LGBT+ community. Warren County Pride Day is made possible by a donations, and a team of individuals (queer and straight) who work together throughout the year to bring Warren County Pride Team into fruition.

Why a Banned Book Club?

"Why would anyone tell you what you can read"?

"If someone tells me not to read something I would ask why."

Both of these statements were made by our 7-year-old daughter when we were explaining that we joined a banned book club. She understood the book part, they have been a part of her life from the start. It was the word 'banned' that peaked her curiosity. She didn't understand and I must admit, neither did I.

A college professor once told our class that, "if a book offends or upsets you, ask yourself why, don't just stay offended."

When the opportunity came to meet with other community members and discuss a list of banned

books we were excited. We were curious to learn why they were considered not appropriate and wanted to know if we felt that way too. So far, none of them have. If they are upsetting at all, it is because they depict real life situations that no one should have to deal with, but we do. If we ban books that tell those stories, we are telling people that their reality doesn't exist, or that it isn't a story important enough to share. The silence that has existed surrounding events and life stories such as these remains deafening. How can the next generation of adults examine and continue to repair their communities if the adults in their world today encourage their silence? We open the doors to the banned book club so we can have a discussion worthy of everyone's time. So we can talk about these

books when they eventually make their way into the hands of friends, family, coworkers and community members.

ALL BOYS AREN'T BLUE is a great example. The author shares his experience of what it was like to grow up as a black and gay child and young man. It starts out with a description of his being beaten by neighborhood boys. More of these experiences are included and it ends in a thoughtful and inviting way. The author shares that he didn't have any books to read or role models to emulate, so he hopes his story is that for someone else. That is why we should not ban this book, but we invite you to decide this for yourself.

Community Spotlight #8: LGBT Funds of the Erie Community Foundation

The LGBT Funds of the Erie Community Foundation strive to address the challenges that LGBTQ+ individuals in Erie County face every day. With a generous gift in 2014, the Greater Erie Alliance for Equality helped to establish the LGBT Funds of The Erie Community Foundation. Today, the Funds are led by a volunteer advisory board and various committees and aim to provide financial support to nonprofits in the Erie area that address strive to create a positive, thriving environment for LGBTQ+ individuals.

The LGBT Funds consist of the LGBT Community Endowment Fund, which generates impactful grants for nonprofit organizations and projects throughout NWPA. Grants focus on key priorities such as safe schools, youth homelessness, mental health, substance use, suicide prevention, health and wellness, housing and workplace equality and family support and recognition. Additionally, the LGBT Funds include scholarships to support the next generation of leaders in creating a positive environment for the local LGBTQ+ community. The LGBT Funds Committee will begin accepting applications for the next grant cycle on September 14th.

The LGBT Funds recently held their first education session, "The Landscape of LGBTQ+ Affirm-

ing Healthcare in Erie: A Panel Discussion." The group has plans for a September 20 session on aging in the LGBTQ+ community, featuring a screening of the documentary film "Gen Silent" and a panel discussion.

Potential donors have the option to contribute to the LGBT Funds Community Endowment for grantmaking, donate to one of the named scholarship funds, or create their own named fund. Volunteers are also welcome to join the board and committees to help plan events, raise funds, set strategies and determine scholarship recipients.

The LGBT Funds' goal is to continue convening community conversations and expand their reach each year. The LGBT Funds rely on the support of individuals attending events, volunteering, and making donations to further their grantmaking efforts and support local nonprofits. The Master Plan will also reflect the needs and preferences of this population to live where they choose and access the supports they need to thrive and age in place.


The department remains committed to ensuring that Pennsylvanians of all sexual orientations and gender identities are able to grow older with access to resources and services that are inclusive, culturally sensitive, and LGBTQ+-affirming. is trauma-sensitive yoga? It is facilitated by a yoga instructor with extra training to be aware of how movement and positioning of our body sometimes brings up 'old wounds.' Each class is supported by at least one trained therapist who is available to assist people with processing should anything come up during the class. People often wonder if it is any different than the yoga classes they have been to or have seen. Some differences are:

- The yoga instructor takes time to ask you what your needs are before the class. Do you have an old injury or a disability which needs to be accommodated? Do certain positions make you uncomfortable or bring you distress?
- Billy, the yoga instructor we work with here, also reminds us that everyone's practice is different. If you remain seated in your chair the whole time and the person next to you is standing, that's okay. If you want to rest in place and just 'be' in a safe and calming environment, you are welcome to do so.
- Our classes are small, there are up to 6 participants for each class. People don't need to worry about a dozen super-fit people bending like pretzels while you're trying to reach your hand above your head.

We are particularly encouraging of LGBTQ+ folks, 'neuro-spicy' peeps, those who are HIV+, and people with differing abilities to participate. We know that it is difficult for many of us to learn how to exist in our body. Maybe our whole lives we have been avoiding any feeling because it was the wrong body, it was when we were in our body when we felt betrayed, abandoned, shamed, or hurt. Will Koehler, one of the therapists who supports the TSyoga classes shares, "So often in my work with those transitioning or nonbinary, I see people struggle with trauma-focused treatment because they have grown used to living in their head. We know though, that stress, anxiety, depression, and PTSD symptoms happen IN our bodies. To heal from our stored-up trauma, we need to learn that it is safe to get out of our head and take up residence in our body. Trauma sensitive yoga is designed to facilitate this type of gentle healing.

Removal of Blasco Library Read With Pride Display

On Tuesday, July 11, to raise awareness of the Blasco Memorial Library, approximately 25 people from Democratic Socialists of Erie and the Pennsylvania Equality Project attended the Erie County Council meeting. Ten attendees spoke during the open mic session and shared why Library Director Karen Pierce erred when ordering the moving of the Pride Month display or its ultimate dismantlement. Several speakers demanded that the County Executive, Brenton Davis, and Director Pierce issue public apologies to the LGBTQIA+ community. Others insisted that the Pride display be returned to the Children's section for an additional month as a sign that ongoing discrimination will not occur. Pennsylvania Equality Project President David Moore attended the Council meeting and said.

"People of all ages with varied sexual orientations and gender identities exist, including youth. They use the library. They attend local public schools. Families with two moms, two dads, and a wide variety of other arrangements exist right here in Erie County. They should not suffer discrimination or hate simply because a few complaints come to the attention of the library director or the County Executive."

Erie County Council Vice Chairwoman Mary Rennie addressed the council after the public speaker portion of the meeting had concluded. She said that she was once the library's director and that she found Director Pierce's actions to be "atrocious" but stopped short of calling for the return of the Pride display this year.
