

Erie Community Continues to Give!

This year's annual Erie Gives event was held on Tuesday, August 8, and while it had a rocky start due to some technical issues and a fire alarm near the end of the night, it was a good day for local nonprofits throughout the area. All told, \$8,268,471 was raised, benefiting 493 local nonprofits. Among those who helped are the local Queer nonprofits listed below.

Asymptomatic HIV

Erie County Department of Health

Did you know that HIV has three stages? The first is referred to as Acute HIV Infection which usually develops within 2 to 4 weeks after exposure to HIV that creates the infection. Flu-like symptoms can occur during this time; such as fever, headache, and rash. The amount of measurable HIV in the blood is very high and increases the risk of transmitting the

virus. The second stage is referred to as Chronic HIV Infection, also called Asymptomatic HIV Infection. This is when the virus multiplies in the body at very low levels. Most individuals don't notice anything or feel sick/ill. In fact, people living with chronic HIV might not have any symptoms at all. However, without medications, the chronic HIV infection tends to advance into stage three around 10 years or longer. This is why it's important to get tested regularly and know your status. The third stage is referred to as AIDS [acquired immunodeficiency syndrome]. This is the disease that develops after HIV has severely harmed our immune system, leading to infections that the body cannot fight off. People living with HIV are typically diagnosed with AIDS if their CD4 count is less than 200 cells/mm3 or if they have specific opportunistic infections. When diagnosed with AIDS, a person can have a high HIV count and transmit it very easily to others. Treatment is key and vitally important at this stage because people with AIDS typically survive around 3 years. Do you know your HIV status? Consider getting tested for free at the Erie County Department of Health. We

Underdog BBQ

This month I visited Underdog BBQ, a local business with a unique history, to talk with owner Ashley Messenger. The story begins in 2019 when entrepreneur Glenn Stearns came to Erie as part of the television series Undercover Billionaire. With only \$100 in his pocket, he was given just 90 days to create and grow a business worth one million dollars.

Ashley's brother was working with Glenn, and she agreed to help out. This eventually led to a kitchen manager's position for her. Glenn returned to his everyday life and left his staff to manage the business without him. Like most restaurants, COVID

hit the industry hard. Following this, Glenn had concerns about keeping the business going, and he had an opening for a manager, a job he offered to Ashley, who had studied culinary arts and food and beverage management at Mercyhurst. She loves a challenge, so she accepted the position and was able to increase business significantly. Despite this turnaround, Glenn decided to sell the business and offered Ashley a great deal, so she bought it.

Like her staff, Ashley has lived her entire life in Erie, making Underdog BBQ a genuinely local business. In the summer of 2022, she could not renew her lease, so she made an offer on the former Perkins restaurant on West 8th Street and closed within three weeks. They spent a year on renovations, relying on catering and their food truck to keep things going. With a soft opening on July 18, 2023, Underdog BBQ is back in business.

Ashley says her current staff is the best team she ever had, and they all support each other. They want everyone who visits to feel welcome and safe. They have attended multiple community events, including Meadville Pride and the Health Expo, and will host the Aging with Pride monthly social at the end of this month. Ashtabula Pride, Inc. Formed

Ashtabula Pride, Inc. was founded in June 2023 by Rebekah Beeman and Michael Riffe as a new vision and focus for the county's Pride festival. The first festival was started in 2020 by the late Pastor Bill Daywalt, Pastor John Werner, Librarian A.J. Petro, and Drag Queen Mona Lotz (Riffe), who met weekly to transform Daywalt's plan of a Pride Picnic into a much larger event, a PRIDE FESTIVAL! In just a few weeks, those four and a select number of volunteers orchestrated the first annual Pride Ashtabula County festival, attended by over 3,000 people of all ages and walks of life! Immediately following the festival, the four and their volunteers formed the LGBTQ Coalition of Ashtabula County Inc., focusing on outreach and education for the county.

The Coalition endured many changes in its first three years that distracted focus on the festival. Beeman and Riffe proposed that the board remove Pride from the Coalition's covering and make it its own separate entity. With the amount of work needed to conduct a festival of this magnitude and the Coalition's main focus of outreach and education, the board gave their full-hearted blessing to this new structural idea. These two independent organizations work together to bring forth their visions for the LGBTQ+ Community of Ashtabula County.


Community Spotlight #9: Compton's Table

Compton's Table, with its mission to foster a sustainable and affirming environment, has swiftly become a beacon of hope and community for queer youth and young adults in Erie County. Compton's Table was founded in response to the deeply concerning rates of suicide among queer youth in the United States, spurring founder and queer rights advocate, Dr. Tyler Titus, into action.

Deeply rooted in the queer community, even the organization's name holds LGBT+ historical significance drawing inspiration from the Compton's Cafeteria Riot of 1966. This event marked a turning point in the LBTQ+ rights movement with an uprising against discrimination. Compton's Table works to support the queer community in the same spirit of resilience and service. Presently, Compton's Table stands as evidence to the strength of communitydriven initiatives in Erie County. As a fully volunteer based organization, it offers belonging to those who

The organization hosts a range of events tailored to diverse age groups.
