Erie's Zone Dance Club, a symbol of queer community and celebration, proudly marks its 25th year. This venue's enduring journey began in November 1998 as new owner Bob Regan transformed the Embers into The Zone, which continued to serve Erie's LGBTQ+ community. After six years of resounding success, The Zone moved to its present location at 133 West 18th Street, formerly "The Village," another cherished gay bar. The club is a constant presence, open 365 days a year, with only brief interruptions during COVID-19 and the unforgettable 2017 Snowmageddon snowstorm.

Beyond a mere bar, The Zone offers a welcoming haven for Queer individuals. With its diverse clientele, vibrant drag shows, spacious dance floor, and weekly events, it's a home away from home. The staff's remarkable bond has created a heartfelt, if occasionally 'dysfunctional,' community, and many patrons are integral to it.

The Zone's impact extends through its collaborations with Erie LGBTQ+ organizations like Compton's Table, and Greater Erie Alliance for Equality

(GEAE), and NWPA Pride Alliance, establishing itself as a vital social hub that fortifies and unites the local queer community.

Special events adorn their calendar, including the annual Pink Party, celebrating its 18th year in 2023, the glamorous Miss Erie drag pageant, and weekly shows headlined by beloved local talent. Their grandest celebrations take center stage during Pride, Halloween, and New Year's festivities. Through their journey, they've navigated obstacles, faced the loss of friends and family, and confronted hatred and abuse, emerging as a steadfast and unyielding community.

Looking ahead, The Zone is committed to ongoing improvements in their establishment and aesthetics, creating an even more welcoming and inclusive space for the LGBTQ+ community. 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## Hoping to empower others, one queer book at a time

Some of Erie's Queer community worked together to collect many queer books for distribution throughout the area via the Little Free Library System. In conjunction with Banned Book Week, which ran from October 1-7, books were collected at Journey to a Trauma Informed Life on the evening of Tuesday, October 3.

Volunteers helped sort through the 474 books as well as add QR codes to them. The goal is for someone to find a queer book who may not have access to them. This past summer, the week before the annual Pride celebration in Erie, librarians were forced to remove a queer book display at the library's main branch due to unpublished complaints. Similarly, banned books have been removed from school district libraries such as Penncrest in Crawford County. The QR codes would then direct the reader to the NW PA Pride Alliance's website with links to the other eight local queer organizations that helped to make

this event possible.



### **New HIV Clinical Trial Begins**

Erie County Department of Health

In the US and South Africa, people are volunteering for a new HIV vaccine Phase 1 trial. The new vaccine, "VIR-1388", tests safety and kicking off an HIV specific immune response in folks. VIR-1388 is to tell the human immune system to create T cells. These T cells would recognize HIV, prompting an immune response. The trial goal is to prevent HIV from establishing a chronic infection. The NIAID (National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases) and NIH (the National Institutes of Health) have provided scientific and financial support for years in this HIV vaccine idea and is contributing money for this study. Study participants are randomly put into one of four parts. Three out of four will receive a different dose of the vaccine. One out of four will get a placebo (fake vaccine). Late 2024 is when results are expected from the trial. Then volunteers will be followed for up to three years after their first vaccine dose. Did you know the Erie County Department of Health provides routine checks for Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Syphilis, and HIV? We can go over options for treatment here in Erie County and help get you started. Would you like some FREE condoms? We provide free condoms and lubricants to our clients during weekly Sexual Health Clinic appointments on Tuesdays 9am-11am and Wednesdays 1pm-3pm. ## Community Spotlight #11: Erie County HIV Task Force

The Erie County HIV Task Force is a collaboration of local organizations and individuals dedicated to educating, supporting, and advocating for people living with HIV/AIDS and preventing the spread of infection in Erie County, Pennsylvania. Formed in 2014 by Laura Beckes and Sylvia Holland at the Erie County Health Department, the group has been bringing together Erie County volunteers to increase the awareness of HIV, its treatment, and prevention for our residents. Groups involved have included Adagio Health, Central Outreach Wellness Center Erie, Community Health Net, Edinboro University, Erie Gay News, Erie VA Medical Center, Greater Erie Alliance for Equality, Guadenzia, LECOM, MidAtlantic AIDS Education Training Center, NWPA

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Medical Reserve Core, NWPA Pride Alliance, PA Thrive Partnership, SafeNet, TransFamily, UPMC Hamot, and Urban Ministries.

The HIV Task Force has focused its efforts on the following areas: Collaboration to benefit Erie County residents with providers of prevention and treatment for HIV work toward Ending the HIV Epidemic and advocating to champion awareness of HIV and STI safety, which has included our successful Condom Distribution Program across the City of Erie and beyond. Being a resource to the public in allowing Erie County residents to consider options for improving their lives regarding HIV and STIs. Educating through lectures for the local care provider community, one-on-one sessions with patients, and outreach with awareness day events. And providing support activities for testing options at various locations around Erie County.

The HIV Task Force meets monthly with inperson and virtual options open to the public. In the spring, we host an annual HIV/AIDS Awareness Walk. Our members participate in the summer's strongly attended Pride Fest and Parade. Each year, on December 1st, we host an AIDS Memorial Service event as well. These events, along with news about items in the HIV medical community, can be found on our social media accounts on Facebook and Twitter as well as our website. In addition to these specific programs, the HIV Task Force in 2016 developed a countywide Condom Distribution Program, which began with making brown bags of condoms, literature on testing/treatment, and lube available at public venues. After the COVID-19 pandemic, this program was expanded into a private, free home mailing service for Erie County residents. Individuals can order a dozen condoms for free to be sent via the mail to their address. This provides an option for folks who cannot get to a distribution site or prefer a confidential option.



Anyone interested in learning more about the Erie County HIV Task Force is welcome to join a meeting, attend an event, or reach out to Gary Snyder, the Task Force Chair, at the Erie County Department of Health. Volunteers are always welcome, especially when we hold condom-bagging events or host other activities. Volunteer opportunities could involve resupplying condoms bags at sites, attending local activities to promote awareness and providers, organizing events within Erie County, and more including providing feedback on our plans and ideas by contacting us at 814-315-3375 or admin@echiv.org

## Adagio Health is now offering PEP for HIV!

Adagio Health is now offering PEP for HIV! PEP, also known as post-exposure prophylaxis, is a medication taken after exposure to HIV to lower the chance of getting HIV. It has to be started no more than 72 hours after the exposure to work. Adagio Health has this medication stocked in the office, so it can be started right away. Appointments are available by calling the office or online at adagiohealth. org. Walk-ins are also accepted, but there may be a wait to be seen.

## F-A-U-L-K-N-E-R: Erie's Unconventional Write-in Campaign

Susannah Faulkner's venture into Erie politics has been nothing short of intriguing. While she narrowly missed securing a two-year term on the City Council by just 300 votes, her return to the political scene has taken an unconventional path in her quest to keep her seat.

Faulkner is encouraging Erie's residents to support her through a write-in campaign, asserting that



the city deserves fresh alternatives. In this grassroots political effort, candidates seek to win elected positions without the official ballot listing. Though less common, write-in campaigns serve as a legitimate way for individuals to seek public office.

Faulkner's commitment to improving Erie, particularly for its youth and families, is evident through her work on the council and her active engagement in community initiatives. Notably, she has demonstrated her support for the LGBTQIA community by championing a resolution that officially designates Erie as an LGBT sanctuary city.

Write-in campaigns, although unconventional compared to the traditional candidacy process, offer candidates a democratic means to challenge the status quo and provide voters with fresh choices. Faulkner's endeavor embodies this spirit, underscoring the importance of new perspectives and an informed electorate in Erie City.

What strategies would you use to include and engage LGBTQIA+ organizations and community members in developing policy and legislation?



### **Erie County Council District 1**

### Non-Discrimination

Terry Scutella (D-Inc)

Erie County Council oversees the Human Relations Commission which works to eliminate discrimination housing, employment and public accommodations. Now under new leadership, the Human Relations Commission will be making sure Erie County residents are aware of the services they provide including investigation and legal services. The Human Relations Commission enforces the Erie County Human Relations Commission ordinance which protects the civil rights of individuals.



### Cody Foust (R)

The Pennsylvania Human Relations Act of 1955 allows for cities, townships, boroughs, and counties to pass ordinances creating local human relations commissions that can enforce policies on nondiscrimination. The Erie County Human Relations Commission works to eliminate discrimination in employment, housing and public accommodations.

Ordinance 82,2021 voted on by county council lays out the ground work for employment in Erie County shall not be discriminated against, more information can be found at https://eriecountypa.gov/departments/human-relations-commission/.

### Cultural Competency Training

Terry Scutella (D-Inc)

Most of the training I have involved on-thejob cultural literacy training. However, the Human Resources department continues to offer cultural training for the Erie County Employees.

### **Erie County Council District 2**

### Anti-Discrimination

Rock Copeland (D)

We need leadership with good intentions. We need compliance and enforcement of nondiscrimination policies to be pursued in good faith.

On August 29th, the County Council voted on a resolution to ban censorship at the library in compliance with state and county standards. Many people came to speak about this issue, out of concern for the censorship of the pride display at the library. Yet, one council person requested an interesting clarification. "All the reading material is still there, still available?" Another said, "Just to expand on that point, I just want to make sure when we talk about censorship and this issue...my understanding was that the material was present the entire time...I don't feel that there was any censorship on the part of the library." After these points were made, the Council felt comfortable voting unanimously to approve the resolution, knowing that their interpretation stripped the resolution of meaning.

We need leadership willing to give due respect to these issues, give their legislation the teeth to enforce policy, and to make sure the full intent of policy is immune to creative interpretation.

Having an understanding and empathy for those that you serve is essential to ensuring they are all served according to their needs.

### **Engagement Strategies**

Rock Copeland (D)

The current leadership style of our County Executive is to tell others what they need, not to listen in good faith. There is no attempt to learn about the viewpoints of others. They do not build partnerships with people of different perspectives. He uses phrases like "non-negotiable courage and political will", meaning he wishes to push his agenda regardless of the opinions of others. This is not the model of leadership that we need.

Real leadership requires having an open ear and being accessible to the entire community, regardless of their political leanings or background. This is especially true for any disenfranchised, marginalized, or minority group. It is vital that their perspectives and unique needs are heard and considered. Including and engaging the LGBTQIA+ community is a natural extension of this philosophy. I want people to know that my door is open. I want to hear from you. ### LGBTQIA+ Influence

Rock Copeland (D)

My journey in life, as it relates to my political and philosophical beliefs, has been a long one. I was raised in a religious and conservative home and had a sheltered childhood. This is a background that many in the LGBTQ community would consider less than inviting. Beyond that, societal systems were built to indoctrinate many of us with bigoted and intolerant views. I was not immune to those influences.

In college, I had my first friendship with an "out" gay man. Around that time, one of my friends came out as bisexual. These friendships shattered some of my worldviews. ### Anti-Discrimination Lorraine Dolan (D)

At the county level, it's crucial that our contracting processes prioritize fairness and equality. I

would push for regular audits of our county contractors to ensure they're compliant with nondiscrimination policies. Additionally, it's crucial to provide consistent training and awareness programs for those in charge of county contracting to ensure that LG-BTQIA+ rights are always front and center.

### Cultural Competency Training Lorraine Dolan (D)

Interacting with diverse communities within our county has been an enlightening experience. While I value these interactions, I believe formalized training is essential. For county staff, I'd recommend a foundational course on LGBTQIA+ rights and issues. For council members, a more in-depth training, perhaps featuring stories and experiences from our own LGBTQAI+ residents, would be valuable to inform our policymaking. I have participated in opportunities for equity training through my tenure with the League of Women Voters.

### **Engagement Strategies**

For our county to thrive, it is vital that all voices be heard. I'd propose a regular liaison or committee to bridge county government with LGBTQIA+ organizations. Through town halls, focus groups and even digital forums, we could ensure the community is continually engaged, addressing needs and concerns to directly influence county policy. I am approachable, listen and respond.

In my journey to represent District 7, I met an LGBTQIA+ couple advocating for more inclusive county policies. That's a bit of a challenging question how would I assure that Erie implements and enforces contractor nondiscrimination policies... I think that first of all I would have a meeting of the licensing board, Kristy Williams from the code enforcement, fourth floor of City Hall manages all the trade licenses/ contractors in Erie. Once a month or so they meet in council chambers. I would discuss this issue and invite them to share with me how this could be attained. I would also bring this question up at the Human Relations Commission meeting too. After these two things have been addressed I would talk to the solicitors at Erie City Hall and Erie County to advise me on what we could put in writing as an agreement that would be legally binding. Right now I have noticed that we are having a type of crisis in not having enough contractors to do jobs on houses. The Erie Redevelopment Authority is looking to hire more contractors. There is a long wait-list of housing request projects to be finished. Perhaps the code enforcement people that go out now visiting sites unannounced etc could add this to their checklist or hire someone specifically to travel around.

*Tyler Titus (D)* 

As the only candidate who is openly identifying as queer, and someone who continues to work at a local, state, and federal level on nondiscrimination policy development and implementation, I am equipped and prepared to ensure contractors utilized at a city level have an active and enforced an inclusive nondiscrimination policy.

### Cultural Competency Training Kathleen Schaaf (D)

Another challenging one, to what extent have you participated in LGBTQIA+ cultural competency training what types of training would you recommend for staff and council members. The last year I was on city council I attempted to bring the council together for informal type of training/assessment from a certified person in Pittsburgh to assist us. I ended up unfortunately faltering in this endeavor, I had gotten the council to have it voted that we would but not all of council wanted to participate even though it had passed that we would work on it. It is a challenge to get seven people on council committed to one specific

issue whether it be fulfilling and beneficial. There are virtual and online workshops and training which is helpful in the areas of diversity, equity and inclusion. The Greater Erie Area Alliance on Equality would be helpful as well as a nonprofit organization too. I could look into some of the programs that our new city police hires have participated in that were helpful.

My forty years of being an educator has lead me to various life experiences in and out of our city and state. I am presently on the Human Relations Advisory Board and was the liaison to the HRC and HRCA when I was on council previously.

My highschool, St Benedict Academy and Villa Maria College guided and inspired my philosophy of treating all people with respect. While on council I was the first to sponsor that a person should not be forced into conversion therapy.

Over the past decade, not only have I participated in training, but I continue to have the honor of conducting queer competency trainings across the country. I recognize training as a step in the right direction; however, we must move the momentum and focus to action. We need policy updates, by-law amendments, procedural adjustments, and proactive steps to protect all community members, especially those most at risk of systemic harm.

### **Engagement Strategies**

Kathleen Schaaf (D)

Encourage all people and groups to attend more council meetings, study sessions, and department meetings. Invite the LGBTQ+ spokespersons to attend by invitation council caucuses. Revitalizing the neighborhood watch meetings would be helpful and have council attend and talk at them more than they do at present. Each council person has a cell phone and email which anyone can use to email a council member addressing issues that they would like to see addressed. Council could attend LGBTQ+ meetings as well. The Erie City Hall Communications Director could pass on news/community engagement happenings to Erie Gay News if it doesn't already now.

Tyler Titus (D)

I served as the Co-Vice Chair of the Commission of LGBTQIA Affairs for Governor Tom Wolf for four years and this has built a strong network across the Commonwealth. I currently serve on the Democratic State Committee LGBTQ caucus as the

secretary which has created an opportunity to collaborate on developing inclusive policy, by-laws, and procedures. I am 100% committed to replicating this while serving as a City Council person.


### LGBTQIA+ Influence Kathleen Schaaf (D)





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
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
