viewed the importance of improving care and testing access for Erie residents. Andi Fair reviewed the current options for HIV Prevention. Sonny Concepcion moderated an interview segment with two guests that discussed their diagnosis journey from the 1980s to today and how today's available medicines give them fulfilling lives while having undetectable HIV.

This year's program also included the I AM A WORK OF ART project involving the public, Community Health Net / PA Thrive Partnership clients, and Journey to a Trauma Informed Life. The word ART this year has a dual meaning. As a medical term, ART is an acronym for Anti-Retroviral Therapy - a combo of meds taken to make HIV undetectable. which creates no risk of transmission to others. ART also represents creativity and imagination through various forms of expression. During art therapy sessions held in October and November 2023, participants created submissions of designs/pieces currently on display for December in the Blasco Memorial Library at 160 E Front St, Erie, PA 16507. The Independent Council on Aging of Erie, PA, publishes an annual directory of services and resources. In addition to a listing in the directory, Aging With Pride has also purchased an ad in the 2024 edition. The directory is distributed throughout the year at service providers and senior resource fairs. Thanks to Ray, Erie Gay News will now be distributed at all seven senior centers in Erie County.

At the following Aging With Pride meeting on December 3, Central Outreach Wellness Center of Erie's Outreach Coordinator and Case Manager, Gabe Genua, presented info on the services and resources that Central Outreach provides. Several Aging With Pride members already access services at Central Outreach. Aging With Pride was very grateful for Gabe's informative presentation and appreciated his help being more aware of what the organization offers.

NW PA Pride Alliance reflects on a full 2023

The NW PA Pride Alliance would like to take a moment to reflect and thank all those who have helped make 2023 a success.

Most notably known for planning and hosting the Erie Pride Fest and Parade, many may be surprised to learn the Pride Alliance works throughout the year to enhance visibility, foster unity, and promote acceptance through roughly forty events and programs, creating an inclusive space for all in Northwest Pennsylvania.

The year's highlight for the NW PA Pride Alliance has always been the annual Pride Fest celebration in Perry's Square in Erie. Thousands come from

around the region to participate in the festivities. Continued for 2023 was the Meadville Pride and Street Fair, which also saw growth. NW PA Pride Alliance is one of only a few Pride organizations that put on multiple Prides during the year.

Another high point of the year for the Pride Alliance was the 30th annual Pride Picnic. The Pride Picnic was held once again at the Rotary Pavilion on Presque Isle, allowing the community to gather with their chosen family.

New for this year was a Pride Prom held in May at the Ambassador Banquet and Conference Center. The board wanted to provide a fun atmosphere for those who may not have been able to attend their own prom or who may not have been able to attend with the person they would have preferred to. For those who had a good time, the Pride Alliance is happy to announce that this will return in 2024.

The NW PA Pride Alliance has also been visible throughout the area by participating in local parades. Members have walked in the Millcreek Fourth of July parade and the Penn West Edinboro Homecoming parade for many years. They have also most recently made the Meadville Halloween Parade an annual tradition. In addition, the Pride Alliance hosts monthly Happy Hours on the first Wednesday of the month at Oasis Pub in Erie and on the fourth Wednesday of the month in Meadville, alternating between Julian's Bar and Grill and Cussawago Creek Distillery. The year would not be complete without a trip to support the

local sports teams in Erie, with Pride Nights being celebrated with the Otters and Seawolves.

Teaming up with other Queer organizations, the NW PA Pride Alliance helped to give back to our larger community by helping to host some give back events throughout the year. The Boots and Coats drive, which benefited Community Shelter Services, was held in January to help provide much-needed items during Erie's cold winters. In May, the Alliance helped with the collection of nonperishable food items, which were donated to the Second Harvest Food Bank of NW PA.

Another new endeavor started by the Pride Alliance in conjunction with eleven other local queer organizations was to host the first-ever Banned Book Drive held in Northwestern Pennsylvania, focusing on queer-themed books. The banned books were collected and then distributed throughout the community by use of the United Ways Small Library System. This was seen as such an asset to the Queer community that it helped inspire other collections throughout the Commonwealth.



transgender individuals and shared reflections from their friends and family. Sadly, we know the number is much larger, and these are just the ones who have been proven and reported. TransFamily chooses to focus on the positive aspects of these lost siblings when remembering these lives taken far too soon.

Sadly, 87% of the victims were people of color. 50% were Black transgender women. 77% were killed with a gun. 43% of the known victims were killed by a romantic/sexual partner, friend, or family member. Finally, 50% were misgendered or deadnamed by authorities or the press. (Source: hrc. org)

Community Spotlight #13: Pennsylvania Equality Project

On June 20, 2011, David Moore was watching live coverage on C-Span of the New York state legislature voting to enact marriage equality for same-sex couples. He was so moved that he formed a group of like-minded people on Facebook and called it Gay Marriage for Pennsylvania. When enough people in the group expressed to him that the name overlooked far too many people in the LGBTQIA2S+ community, he changed the name to Marriage Equality for Pennsylvania (ME4PA). In 2012, Joshua Szczesny joined ME4PA; together, David and Josh built the

organization into a small nonprofit. However, by August 2014, with marriage equality already law in Pennsylvania, he changed the name to Pennsylvania Equality Project (PEP). The organization he founded now focuses on surveys related to housing, discrimination, bullying, and mental health. PEP also offers the Meadville FreeShop, held two or three times per year at the Meadville Public Library.

The organization is applying to the FCC for a low-watt FM radio station license to serve Crawford County and provide live programming about the LG-BTQIA2S+ community across PA. David hopes to open volunteer on-air talent opportunities for students from local schools and colleges. While these initiatives are of a localized nature, PEP also has a listing of resources, petitions, and events and conducts surveys on its website. Stalking victims from the LGBTQ+ community encounter distinct challenges, setting their experiences apart from those of their heterosexual counterparts. When assisting LGBTQ+ stalking victims, safety planning takes on a specialized approach. This involves considerations such as including hormones, HIV prevention, and necessary medications in a personalized "to go bag."

Adding another layer to the complexity, some LGBTQ+ victims find it challenging to disengage from current or former intimate partners due to limited dating experiences within the LGBTQ+ community. This underscores the need for tailored support and understanding of the unique aspects shaping the experiences of LGBTQ+ stalking victims.
