McMillan prides her salon to be an all-inclusive establishment that has not lost focus following the petty vandalization. To help combat the passiveaggressive response that motivated the nameless individual(s), McMillan went as far as to donate to the Northwest Pennsylvania Pride Alliance. One senseless action replaced one with respect and dignity. It is a testament to the resilience of our allies who help carry our message of inclusivity throughout the community.

Compton's Table Back To School



US House Proposes Cuts in HIV Funds

from Erie County Department of Health

Recently, the US House Appropriations Committee advanced on a party-line vote a legislative package that would slash funding for the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) for fiscal 2025 by \$7.5 billion, or 6.4 percent, below the fiscal 2024 level. The bill cleared the committee 31 to 25 and now heads to the full House, which is scheduled to vote on it before August. The House's proposal drastically reducing funding to Title X, the Ending the HIV Epidemic initiative, and other critical programs, as well as the House's inclusion of language restricting access to abortion, limiting care for LGBTQ individuals, and drastically restructuring the National Institutes of Health. This bill would cut the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) injury prevention program and its opioid overdose preven-

tion and surveillance initiative.

The US Senate is expected to mark up its version of the Labor-HHS bill before August and has allocated additional funds for non-defense discretionary funding compared to the House. The final negotiations on the Fiscal Year 2025 Labor-HHS bill are not expected until after the November elections this year. When the current fiscal year ends on September 30th, programs will likely be funded under a continuing resolution at the current Fiscal Year 2024 levels through sometime in December late this year. While work is progressing to reduce the number of HIV infections in the US, taking away money from valuable programs makes it harder for people working in HIV care and prevention to continue making improvements.

The Erie County Department of Health uses Federal and State funding to provide free testing for STIs and HIV. We can help you learn about treatments here in Erie County. Would you like some FREE condoms? We provide free condoms and lubricants to clients in our Sexual Health Clinic. Weekly clinic is Tuesdays 9 am-11 am and Wednesdays 1 pm-3 pm. Local Queer Nonprofits Participate in Erie Gives 2024

14-Year-Old Transgender Girl Pauly Likens Brutally Murdered in Western PA

SHARON, Pa. Mercer County officials have confirmed that Pauly Likens, a 14-year-old transgender girl from Sharon who was last seen on June 22, 2024, has been found brutally murdered. The Mercer County Coroner announced on Wednesday that the dismembered human remains found on June 25, 2024 around the Shenango River Lake by Pennsylvania State Police were of Pauly Likens. The Coroner shared that she died by sharp force trauma to her head before being sawed into pieces and abandoned in locations around the lake. DaShawn Watkins, a 29-yearold man from Sharon, was arrested by State Police on July 2, 2024, and has been charged with first-degree murder, abuse of a corpse, aggravated assault, and tampering with physical evidence involving Likens' death. He is being held without bail at the Mercer County Prison. The suspect's preliminary hearing has been rescheduled for July 25, 2024. Today, July 6, 2024, would have been Pauly's 15th birthday.

Police executed a search warrant at the suspect's apartment on July 2, 2024, when blood was found throughout the unit following preliminary tests, as well as a receipt for a purchase of a saw on June 23, 2024. According to reporting from WFMJ 21, the suspect told police he arranged to meet someone that evening through a dating app, and that police used Pauly's phone tracking to place her at the Budd Street

Public Park and Canoe Launch in the early morning hours of June 23, 2024, with security footage appearing to show someone waiting for another person.

Preston Heldibridle, Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Youth Congress said "We are beyond outraged and devastated at Pauly's murder. She was just 14 years old and should have had the opportunity to live a beautiful life ahead of her. Our hearts are shattered for her family and friends. We call on law enforcement to press for the highest charges they can make and to ensure there is a conviction so the man who murdered Pauly never sees freedom again."

Mother Nature vs Pride & Safety

The challenge with bringing together our LGBTQIA+ family for pride is that inevitably we cannot make everyone happy. That was apparent before, during, and after this year's Pride on the Bay 2024 Pridefest hosted by Northwest PA Pride Alliance. Ultimately a concern for the safety of attendees, vendors, and volunteers due to a tornado watch resulted in ending the delayed event. As someone who has hosted, organized, coordinated, participated in, and volunteered with gatherings from a handful to thousands of people, this was not easy nor could it be.

Over the past few years, Erie's Pridefest has grown immensely. So much so, Perry Square as the host venue became difficult to manage from a crowd flow and overall safety perspective. Last year SWAT vehicles were deployed in response to protest activities reported at other prides in the United States. Prior to this year, Liberty Park was a consideration but consistently was booked the same date for another event. That changed for 2024. Months of research for multiple venues was conducted for a comparison of options that would allow the event to not only grow in size, but also address the growing safety needs of thousands of attendees.

When it comes to working with teams of staff from Public Safety, Emergency Response units, Law Enforcement, and beyond, the ability to assure everyone has an opportunity to be proud without concern for harassment or harm gets very complex. This included contractually mandated security detail, establishing safety checks, while accounting for constant updates from the National Weather Service, and balancing the wants / needs of sponsors, vendors, entertainers, and volunteers.

This is all behind-the-scenes and not really seen or known by the public that lines up to be seen, heard, accepted, and welcomed at Pride. And honestly, they shouldn't have to think much about these things. We take a lot for granted during public activities when we show up to have a good time. And yes, it is completely fair to be critical when things do not turn out like we want or meet expectations.

Immediately after making the decision to cancel the event for everyone's health and safety, online opinions began posting. You should have... Well I would've... Absolutely we that volunteered to organize / manage the event could have done things differently. No one is perfect and to expect as much is futile. Ultimately a tough call was made that broke many hearts including myself and others that were soaked to the bone working to pull off a new version of Pridefest for Erie County.

My hope is that lessons learned from this year will inform the development of future events. This could include contingency plans for outdoor activities that have to quickly pivot to contractual indoor venue spaces with either sponsors or the attendees incurring the costs. Celebrating pride can be joyful but it takes human power, involvement, and in today's society - funding to make it happen. It usually takes rain to make a rainbow, let's shine on.
