National Coming Out Day: Erie Family Photo on Oct 11, 2025


Picture it: Erie, PA 1995. The City of Erie was preparing to celebrate its Bicentennial. The newly energized LGBTQ+ community took a group photo on the steps of the Erie County Courthouse in October of that year to go in the Bicentennial Time Capsule that now is in Bicentennial Tower at Dobbins Landing at the foot of State Street. The October 1995 photo was the very first Family Photo the local community had taken as a community open to the public. The tradition of taking a group photo has continued at the Pride Picnic and other events. 2025 will mark the 30th anniversary of this historic event, and Erie Gay News is organizing another Family Photo on October 11, 2025 (National Coming Out Day) on the steps of the Erie County Courthouse between 11 AM and 1 PM. All groups and LGBTQ+ and supportive individuals are invited to participate. We want to show how the strength and diversity of the community have grown over the past three decades. We need YOU to make this happen.

We have already arranged for a professional photographer to take portraits. In addition to the family photo at noon on that day, they will also take pictures of groups and organizations. Plans are still being finalized, but Erie Gay News is requesting groups and businesses that want a picture with their members/staff to register beforehand so that we can be sure that everyone is appropriately recognized.

Most notably known for planning and hosting the Erie Pride Fest and Parade, many may be surprised to learn the Pride Alliance works throughout the year looking to enhance visibility, foster unity, and promote acceptance through roughly forty events and programs, creating an inclusive space for all in Northwest Pennsylvania.

The NW Pride Alliance works to foster more opportunities for visibility for the queer community.

Additionally, we send copies each year to two international LGBTQIA+ archives: IHLIA in Amsterdam and ArQuives in Toronto.

Erie Gay News is one of only three LGBTQIA+focused publications in Pennsylvania. The other two are Philadelphia Gay News and QBurgh, published online in Pittsburgh.

PA LGBTQ Advocates Release Landmark Statewide Legislative Agenda

HARRISBURG, Pa. - PA's only Pennsylvaniabased statewide LGBTQ advocacy organization in Harrisburg released its second comprehensive LGBTQ legislative agenda. The LGBTQ Legislative Agenda from the Pennsylvania Youth Congress (PYC) provides a robust narrative on 21 specific priority areas for the General Assembly to advance LGBTQ equality, equity, and inclusion across the commonwealth. In total, 45 individual bills are recommended for introduction this coming session in both the House and Senate. PYC's first legislative agenda was released in December 2019.

Over 750,000 LGBTQ Pennsylvanians live across every community in our commonwealth. Many face serious, compounding inequities and disparities that result in devastating outcomes. Preventing and addressing violence and discrimination are among the highest priorities in the legislative agenda. The first nondiscrimination bill for sexual orientation was introduced in 1976, and bills for both gender

identity and sexual orientation have been introduced every session since 2003. Though explicitly LGBTOinclusive local nondiscrimination protections now cover 38% of Pennsylvania's population, a majority do not have them. While nondiscrimination protections would provide a major impact in improving and saving the lives of LGBTO Pennsylvanians, numerous other policies are critically needed. The legislative agenda details other key issues that deal with hate crimes and a conversion therapy ban for minors, but also issues that do not often get largescale public attention, like instituting protocols for transgender individuals in state prisons and county jails, prohibiting nonconsensual surgeries on intersex children, and reforming vital document processes like death certificates.

Preston Heldibridle, Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Youth Congress, said, "The time is now for the General Assembly to come together to advance legislation helping everyone in our communities thrive with equal protection under the law. We recognize that with a divided government, legislation explicitly impacting LGBTQ Pennsylvanians has a tough road ahead. Yet, we must persist in moving forward conversations with legislators about the devastating results of the General Assembly's inaction on the lives of LGBTO Pennsylvanians. Providing this education is critical to helping shift more lawmakers and members of the public to truly understand the urgency of enacting responsible public policy impacting LGBTQ people. We refuse to let those who wish for LGBTQ Pennsylvanians to be extinguished from public life dominate the headlines in Harrisburg. While they introduce cruel bills meant to rile up folks on the fringe, we will be more coordinated than ever before in promoting sensible reforms for

The report additionally includes details on four state budget priorities and two points on visibility related to resolutions and LGBTQ inclusion on the state Capitol grounds. Following the narrative sections, there is a full checklist of the bills PYC recommends the introduction and passage of. Of the 90 total bills highlighted for introduction, only 53 were introduced in the previous 2023-2024 legislative session. PYC encourages returning lawmakers to reintroduce legislation they have championed before, and for new General Assembly members to come forward to work with advocates in ensuring the additional 37 bills are filed in the new session.

In the 2023-2024 legislative session, 71 bills and nine resolutions were introduced that would have had a positive impact on LGBTO Pennsylvanians, and 14 bills were introduced that would have harmed LGBTQ Pennsylvanians. Of those LGBTQ-related bills introduced last session, six positive bills and two resolutions were passed by the state House, and two anti-LGBTQ bills were passed by the state Senate. For the 11th consecutive legislative session, no substantive LGBTQ legislation was enacted into law by the General Assembly. Two years ago, HB 2125 was signed into law on as Act 73 of 2022, which removed 'homosexuality' from the crimes code. While removing any negative law is vital, it is not the same as establishing affirmative protections for LGBTQ Pennsylvanians.

The Pennsylvania LGBTQ Legislative Agenda is being shared with members of the General Assembly and Governor's office.

The new agenda was informed by issues raised at the nine State of LGBTQ+ Pennsylvania Town Halls hosted by PYC in October and November 2024, and through recent meetings of the Pennsylvania Coalition of LGBTQ Organizations, a network of over 50 LGBTQ community organizations facilitated by PYC.

PYC will soon announce the distribution of new local government LGBTQ policy guides for county commissioners, municipal government officials, and school boards to advance LGBTQ inclusion.

The Red Zone

The "Red Zone" is a critical and often overlooked period on college campuses, referring to the first six to eight weeks of the academic year when students, particularly freshmen, are at the highest risk for sexual assault. This period is marked by a convergence of factors that make new students especially vulnerable, including their unfamiliarity with campus resources, a desire to fit in, and increased social activity, often involving alcohol.

During the Red Zone, incoming students are navigating new social environments and building relationships, which can sometimes lead to situations where boundaries are crossed. The pressures of adapting to college life can also make students less likely to recognize or avoid risky situations.
