Compton's True North Program Looking for Applicants

Compton's Table provides a host of programs aimed to help the queer community in Erie County thrive. True North: Empowering Queer Youth for Independence is one of the programs offered to help young people integrate successfully into adulthood.

Created and facilitated by the Compton's Table Board, True North aims to provide young queer people with the foundational skills to enter and succeed in adulthood. The program is divided into 4 two hour-long sessions that run over a 4 week period.

The first week focuses on building community while integrating lessons on social skill development, team building, and reflection. The second week focuses on financial concerns, like how to handle money, banking, taxes, writing, and sticking to a budget, along with information about finding queer-friendly housing, paying bills, roommate etiquette, and apartment basics.

Week three centers on self-care and hygiene. Facilitators discuss mental health and physical hygiene, how to keep living spaces clean, and who to reach out to if additional help is needed. The fourth and final session centers on "Adulting 101"-- information like maintaining a healthy diet and forming positive relationships with others. All of these sessions and information are offered free of charge to members of the Erie County queer community.

The Laramie Project at McDowell Little Theatre Jan 30-Feb 1

From the director: Come out to the McDowell Little Theatre, 3320 Cuaghey Rd, Erie, PA, this January 30 through February 1, 2025, to experience our production of THE LARAMIE PROJECT.

February marks the 25th anniversary of the show's premiere, which opened just over a year after the murder of Matthew Shepard in October 1998. The play's words are all verbatim transcript interviews with residents of Laramie, Wyoming (and related individuals) after Matthew was attacked, tied to a fence, and left to die. The case swept the country and led to anti-hate-crime legislation in 2009.

Our cast of student actors have not only been rehearsing the show, but they have been researching the "moment work" utilized in writing the play (from the Tectonic Theater Project); learning about the case itself; and journaling about their experiences. On January 15, Mr. Dennis Shepard (Matthew's father) Zoomed in with our cast for a Q&A as we further prepared for the show. He was generous with his time, advocacy, and support.

Some theatre entertains, some theatre inspires, some theatre pushes the boundaries of art, and some theatre engages with contemporary discussions. The students are wrestling with big ideas and working to genuinely portray real people.

I invite you to not only support our young actors but to challenge yourself with a challenging piece of art.

All shows are at 7:00 p.m. (Thursday, 1/30/25; Friday, 1/31/25; and Saturday, 2/1/25). Admission is \$15: seats are general admission rather than specific reserved seats.

LGBT Fund of Erie Community Foundation Grant to Compton's Table

The LGBT Fund of The Erie Community Foundation has awarded a \$7,500 grant to Compton's Table, supporting the organization's transformative True North and Chat n Chill programs. The initiatives, designed to create an affirming environment for LGBTQ+ youth in northwestern Pennsylvania, align with the LGBT Fund's vision for a united, vibrant, and thriving community for LGBTQ+ individuals in the Erie region.

True North provides young queer individuals with life skills training in such areas as budgeting, securing housing, self-care, and career development.

The program of individual empowerment addresses the significant risks faced by LGBTQ+ youth, including high rates of suicide. The Trevor Project reports that more than 40% of LGBTQ youth seriously considered suicide in the past year, underscoring the urgency of supportive interventions like True North.

Chat n Chill complements True North by offering a consistent, judgment-free social environment where participants can apply their new skills and form meaningful connections. Research shows that a sense of belonging significantly reduces suicide risk among queer youth, making these safe spaces not only affirming but potentially life-saving.

The LGBT Fund's mission is to fund and partner in community-led initiatives that advance the local LGBTQ+ population. By supporting programs like True North and Chat n Chill, the Fund contributes to work that addresses this population's unique needs and experiences.

The LGBT Fund welcomes any organization interested in applying for its 2025 grant to contact The Erie Community Foundation for further details. The grants, application of which opens in the fall, support initiatives addressing LGBTQ+ needs in areas such

David Moore Stepping Down as President of Pennsylvania Equality Project

As of January 20, 2025, David Moore is stepping down as President of Pennsylvania Equality Project, and his wife, Jennifer Rahal-Moore, is stepping down as Co-Vice President. The letter sent by Moore to the board about stepping down appears below.

Dear Fellow Board Members:

I am writing to inform you that as of 12:00 AM on January 20, 2025, I am resigning from the position as President of Pennsylvania Equality Project. My wife, Jennifer Rahal-Moore, is simultaneously resigning from her position as a Co-Vice President. Neither of us make this decision lightly.

In June 2011, I realized that if New Yorkers could have marriage rights for same-sex couples, that Pennsylvanians deserve the same rights. I started Marriage Equality for Pennsylvania. We marched in the streets of Erie, Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, and other communities across Pennsylvania. We marched across the entrance to the Capitol in Harrisburg alongside PA State Representative Brian Sims and Pennsylvania Youth Congress Founder, Jason Landau-Goodman.

By August 2014, our name was changed to Pennsylvania Equality Project to continue our efforts to secure other rights such as non-discrimination, allowing transgender youth to use restroom and locker room facilities matching their gender identity, an end to the gay & trans panic defense in court, and an end to conversion therapy for minors.

I am proud of what we have accomplished, and I encourage the remaining Board members to work together. Jennifer and I will remain on the Board of Directors in a non-officer capacity. As of now, I will be stepping down entirely from the Board of Directors in 2027 and joining the Legacy group. As for PEP Radio, I intend to remain in place as General Manager. I will also continue to do the FreeShop event in Meadville with the Board of Directors' approval. I will also serve in an advisory capacity for the Executive Officers and will gladly hand over all documents from the organization's archives.

It is remarkably difficult to finish this work to which I have dedicated 40 years of my life. However, the time has come to allow the younger generation to assume leadership.

Anita Bryant, 70's Anti-Gay Activist, Has Died

Anita Bryant, who became the face of anti-gay activism in the 1970s, died December 16 at the age of 84.

Bryant was once a household name, first as a popular singer and as the ad spokesperson for the Florida Citrus. And then, in 1977, she became America's most well-known homophobe, demonizing gay people and fighting against their rights.

She became involved with anti-gay activism in 1977 when she became leader of the Save Our Children coalition and successfully fought against an anti-discrimination ordinance in Dade County, Florida, that included sexual orientation. During the campaign, she made remarks like, "Homosexuals cannot biologically reproduce children; therefore, they must recruit our children." Her efforts succeeded in repealing the anti-discrimination ordinance.

She would go on to lead and participate in other anti-gay campaigns around the country.

Bryant's remarks and activities galvanized and empowered the gay community. One notable effort was the successful 1977-1980 boycott of Florida Citrus products, where gay bars across North America stopped using orange juice. It was a simple but powerful way to send the message.

In May 1980, Bryant divorced her husband of almost 20 years, citing emotional abuse and suicidal thoughts. Also in 1980, the Florida Citrus Commission stopped using Bryant as a spokesperson.

Also, her activism seems to have caused lost gigs and sponsorships. Some Christian fundamentalists rejected her after the divorce, costing her bookings at their venues and events.

The Red Zone

The "Red Zone" is a critical and often overlooked period on college campuses, referring to the first six to eight weeks of the academic year when students, particularly freshmen, are at the highest risk for sexual assault. This period is marked by a convergence of factors that make new students especially vulnerable, including their unfamiliarity with campus resources, a desire to fit in, and increased social activity, often involving alcohol.

During the Red Zone, incoming students are navigating new social environments and building relationships, which can sometimes lead to situations where boundaries are crossed. The pressures of adapting to college life can also make students less likely to recognize or avoid risky situations.
