Community Mourns Beloved Buffalo Gay Couple

In a tragic incident that has deeply affected Buffalo's Allentown neighborhood, beloved couple Michael "Mickey" Harmon, 40, and Jordan Celotto, 37, were found dead in their home on March 4. After one of them failed to show up for work, a friend checked in on them, encountered a man holding a knife inside the house, and immediately called 911.

When police arrived, they found Harmon and Celotto dead in their basement. The suspect, 34-year-old Bryan Chiclana, had self-inflicted wounds and was taken to Erie County Medical Center for treatment. Investigators say Chiclana allegedly broke into the home through a basement window and fatally attacked both men with a blunt object.

Authorities are saying they do not believe the attack was a hate crime, nor do they have evidence that Chiclana knew the victims. They are describing the murders as a random, isolated act of violence.

814-452-4451 assistance@atozlawerie.com Chiclana has been charged with murder and is being held without bail. The investigation is ongoing as authorities work to piece together the full story behind this heartbreaking tragedy.

Harmon was a well-known artist in Buffalo, known for his intricate drawings of historic homes and landmarks, as well as murals celebrating LG-BTQ+ themes. He co-owned "The Good Stuff," an art gallery and gift shop in Allentown. Celotto, also an artist and music lover, worked at Remedy House café and frequently DJed at Twenty Six Allen, where Harmon was often seen dancing alongside him.

The devastating loss has sparked an outpouring of grief and support. Friends and local businesses have started fundraisers to help with funeral costs. GoFundMe campaigns have also been set up to cover funeral expenses for Harmon and Celotto.

As Buffalo comes together to honor their memory, the spirit and legacies of Mickey and Jordan will live on in the art, music, and love they brought into the world. In times of tragedy, love and community remain the strongest forces.

Day of (No) Silence 2025: Amplifying LGBTQ+ Voices

For years, the GLSEN (Gay, Lesbian & Straight Education Network) Day of Silence was a way for students and allies to bring attention to the silencing of LGBTQ+ voices. But in 2024, the movement took a bold new turn – transforming its longstanding Day of Silence into the Day of (No) Silence. Instead of staying silent, participants are now encouraged to speak up, be loud, and take action against the increasing marginalization of LGBTQ+ individuals, especially transgender and nonbinary people.

This year, the Day of (No) Silence falls on April 4, 2025, and it's all about making noise in the face of discrimination. GLSEN is calling on students, educators, and allies to raise awareness, share stories, and push for change.

Social media will play a big role – expect to see the hashtag #DayofNoSilence trending as people use their voices to advocate for equality. Schools can also get involved by using GLSEN's free toolkits, which offer ideas for classroom discussions, events, and activism.



Boys in the Band at PACA

Michael Weiss is directing The Boys in the Band at PACA, Mart Crowley's 1968 play that premiered just a year before the Stonewall Riots.

According to a 26-year-old review by Caleb Mazzocco, "You are invited to a party where you don't get to try the cracked crab or eat lasagna, you can't drink or dance or converse with the guests, nor can you have a piece of birthday cake. What you can do is sit quietly in the dark and watch the rest of the guests portray a nearly 60-year-old piece of gay history that's an alternately funny and emotional play about 9 men and the birthday party from hell."

Despite its specific context of what used to be considered "self-loathing" among gay men, the play

also explores the struggle for acceptance. It delves into universal human experiences like love, loss, friendship, and the search for meaning, which resonate with audiences in today's changing world. While some critics argue that the play feels dated or doesn't fully address contemporary gay experiences, others will recognize its value as a historical document and a powerful exploration of the human condition. There has been criticism for reinforcing stereotypes, but they are often framed within the play's historical period. Despite the passage of time, and speaking as one who lived in that era (while progress has undoubtedly been made, some things have not changed at all!) The Boys in the Band "continues to be a relevant and vital work of art, sparking discussions about LG-BTQ+ identity, history, and the ongoing struggle for equality. The show opens April 25th at PACA (see ad in this issue) and plays weekends through May 11th.

Compton's Table Awarded Grant from Erie Community Foundation's LGBTQ+ Fund

Compton's Table, a local nonprofit dedicated to supporting LGBTQ+ youth, has been awarded a grant from the Erie Community Foundation LGBT Fund. This funding will enhance the organization's True North program, strengthen its formal teaching initiative, and aid in the development of a new hybrid program to provide support in schools.

The True North program at Compton's Table is a free, four-session program designed to equip LGBTQ+ youth and young adults with essential life skills, including budgeting, finding and maintaining housing, self-care, career development, and more. The initiative aims to empower participants by providing tools to navigate challenges unique to the LGBTQ+ community.

In addition to enhancing True North, the grant will support Compton's Table's formal teaching program and the creation of a new hybrid program, which will allow them to support school environments.

The Erie Community Foundation LGBT Fund works to foster a more inclusive and equitable community for LGBTQ+ individuals in the Erie region. Led by a volunteer advisory board, the Fund supports programs that address disparities in health, safety, education, and opportunity.

Mayor Schember Reacts to Trump Administration Policies

From Erie City Mayor Joe Schember

In recent weeks, my team and I have fielded many questions from concerned members of the LGBTQIA+ community about how the policies of the Trump Administration affect the operations of the City of Erie. I want to reassure everyone that these changes will not affect the operations or policies pursued by my team and me in the City of Erie. We have always been, and will always be, strong allies, and in some cases members, of the LGBTQIA+ community in Erie.

In January of this year, I received the well-publicized letter from the Defense Intelligence Agency stating that it would no longer participate in festivals or other events that featured several marginalized groups, including the LGBTQIA+ community. This agency has not participated in City of Erie events before and, even if it had, its decision has no effect on our events. The City of Erie's events will proceed as they always have.

For my team and I, solidarity with the LG-BTQIA+ community is deeply felt. I am proud to employ people who identify as members of the community, and I am the proud father of a gay man. I'll never forget the day my son, Joe, sat down with my wife and I to tell us that. My immediate reaction was "Joe, I love you. You are my son. I could not be prouder of you." And, we've grown closer since that day several years ago.

I am proud that I am the only Erie Mayor to have walked shoulder-to-shoulder with the community at Pride in every year of my terms, for seven consecutive years. This year, my team and I will again proudly walk in the Erie Pride March and attend Pride events in June.

I am proud that seven years ago, I created the City's first LGBTQ+ Advisory Council. Working together, this team of talented individuals and I have changed and enacted City policies to bring them in line with the recommendations of the Human Rights Campaign's Municipal Equality Index (MEI). As a result of this work, the City of Erie has turned our annual score from 34 when I first took office, to a

perfect 100 for several years in a row.

I am proud that with the strong support of Erie City Council, I enacted the City of Erie's ban on conversion therapy. This harmful practice is now prohibited in the City of Erie.

I want to live in an Erie where diversity is valued by all - where your gender or gender identity, your sexual orientation, the color of your skin, your religion, your ethnic background, your language, your beliefs, and your culture are celebrated. Every person deserves to be treated with dignity and respect. Diversity makes us stronger as a city, as a nation, and as a region. Imagine what an incredible community Erie could be if everyone is welcomed and valued for the unique talents, skills, and ideas that each person possesses!

There will always be work to do to continue the progress to full equality. In the coming weeks and months, I will be meeting with area community leaders to discuss additional ways that City government can assist in working toward this goal.

I understand that these are difficult and fearful times for many in the LGBTQIA+ family. Rest assured that my team and I will always be on your side. You are us and we are you.

Aggregate Housing Survey Results 2023 - 2024

On March 21, the Pennsylvania Equality Project released the results of year two of a five-year study on Housing Affordability and Sustainability for the LGBTQ+ community in Pennsylvania. Among the findings for both years combined is that the 341 respondents represent a total of 845 people from 42 counties across Pennsylvania. Of the 341 respondents, 186 are renting their current home. Almost 70% of LGBTQ+ rental households can barely afford or not afford their current residence. The average monthly income for LGBTQ+ households across Pennsylvania was just over \$3,700. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 5.306%. 

The Red Zone

The "Red Zone" is a critical and often overlooked period on college campuses, referring to the first six to eight weeks of the academic year when students, particularly freshmen, are at the highest risk for sexual assault. This period is marked by a convergence of factors that make new students especially vulnerable, including their unfamiliarity with campus resources, a desire to fit in, and increased social activity, often involving alcohol.

During the Red Zone, incoming students are navigating new social environments and building relationships, which can sometimes lead to situations where boundaries are crossed. The pressures of adapting to college life can also make students less likely to recognize or avoid risky situations.
