Community Spotlight: Erie County HIV Task Force

Since the earliest days of the HIV/AIDS epidemic, Erie County has been directly impacted. The first local case was reported in December 1986, and by then, those diagnosed nationwide were surviving an average of just 15 months. Over the years, a number of support and advocacy groups have worked to raise awareness, support those living with HIV, and fight stigma. Out of this history, the Erie County HIV Task Force was formed in 2014 to carry that

work forward. The group brings together HIV testing and treatment providers, volunteers, and advocates to increase awareness of HIV, its treatment, and prevention.

The Erie County HIV Task Force was founded by a coalition of community leaders - Kelly Kidd and Steven Malinchik from Community Health Net, Sylvia Holland and Laura Beckes from the Erie County Department of Health, Lynn Laurence from the PA Department of Health, Matt Robison from NW PA Pride Alliance, and Michael Mahler from Erie Gay News and NW PA Pride Alliance. The group is chaired by the Erie County Department of Health and serves the entire county, which covers over 270,000 residents.

The Task Force hosts several signature events each year. **World AIDS Day**, observed annually on December 1, is a memorial honoring those lost and a call to action for continued awareness. Since 2018, the group has also organized the **HIV Awareness Walk**, typically held in May, and members are a regular presence at local LGBTQ+ events such as **Erie Pride Fest** and the **Pride Picnic**.

Looking ahead, the Task Force is preparing to launch a new initiative in late 2025 to increase

awareness of **HIV PEP (Post-Exposure Prophylaxis)**. This project will provide vital resources to both healthcare providers and the public about what steps to take if someone believes they may have been exposed to HIV.

The Erie County HIV Task Force meets monthly to discuss local and statewide HIV initiatives, share updates, and plan outreach. Community members are encouraged to get involved, whether through volunteering, attending events, or simply helping to spread awareness.

The show was a surprise hit for sure; we sold out every round. Multiple times, we had to turn

folks away at the door because there wasn't enough space in the theater. Partnering with Voodoo gives us room to grow, plus both food and drinks will be available for the audience to enjoy," said Cherry Falwell.

Each round features five contestants who are new to drag or new faces to the area, showcasing their talent. They're also given a surprise on-stage challenge that tests their ability to think on their stilettoed feet. "Open stages are a great way for newer performers to try things out and introduce themselves to the scene. Our contest is open to all genders and all kinds of drag - queens, kings, things... everybody is welcome," said host Cherry Falwell. Head judge Travis Smith (aka Lady Travesty) and DJ/occasional guest judge Snarebear will both be returning for season two. Guest judges for the season will feature local drag legends. The first round of the second season will be held November 15th at Voodoo Brewing Company in Meadville, PA.

March and Rally in Harrisburg on Oct 26

The Pennsylvania Coalition of LGBTQ+ organizations will be holding a March and Rally at the Capitol in Harrisburg on Sunday, October 26, 2025. We are calling on the LGBTQIA+ community and our allies to join us at the Capitol steps at 1 PM for a march immediately followed by a rally for the following four points:

- LGBTQ+ Rights are Human Rights
- Healthcare is a Human Right
- Healthcare Needs to be Fully Funded
- LGBTQ+ Rights must be Affirmed In the Law

Now more than ever, our healthcare is at risk. Most hospitals that once provided gender-affirming services for people 19 years old and younger have stopped offering such care. HHS Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr. has cut funding for HIV preventive medications and rolled back vaccine prevention options for other illnesses.

Marriage equality is at risk with upcoming Supreme Court cases. Because of the *Mahmoud v. Taylor* case from the US Supreme Court, public schools are at risk of pulling LGBTQIA+ books from school libraries. Our rights and existence are on the line, and we want to send a clear message to government officials at the local, state, and national levels that we are one unified community. Miss Great Lakes Comedy Queen 2025

Miss Great Lakes Comedy Queen, a preliminary to the National Miss Comedy Queen pageant, was held in Batavia, NY, on Saturday, September 6th, celebrating the reign of Great Lakes Comedy Queen 2024, Morticia Monroe. Five contestants representing Northwest Pennsylvania and New York competed for the title. Miss Viola of Elmira, NY, was crowned Miss Great Lakes Comedy Queen 2025, winning awards for Best Outrageous Evening Gown, Best Presentation, and Best 60 Second Spokeswoman. Cherry Falwell of Meadville, PA, was named first alternate, winning awards for Best Interview, Best Comedic Talent, and the audience vote for funniest performer. The evening included entertainment from Erie's own Debbie Does Drag, the current reigning National Miss Comedy Queen. Miss Viola and Cherry Falwell both qualified to compete at National Miss Comedy Queen 2026 in March in Orlando, FL.

Ohio LGBTQ+ Intersectionality Listening Sessions

The Greater Mahoning Valley LGBTQ+ Community Needs Assessment invites you to participate in an intersectionality listening session as part of a local LGBTQ+ research study. This research is important because it helps us understand the needs of the LGBTQ+ community in our area and find ways to support them better. There are six different sessions scheduled to run from October 7 through November 13.

Who can join? Anyone aged eighteen (18) or older who identifies as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, or Questioning who lives in certain counties in Ohio, including Trumbull, Mahoning, Columbiana, or Ashtabula, or those living in the surrounding areas who depend on the Greater Mahoning Valley to meet their needs. One session is scheduled for LGBTQ+ youth ages twelve to seventeen (12-17).

Please note that each participant is eligible to attend a maximum of two (2) intersectionality listening sessions. Please choose the session(s) that best align with your identity and availability, as attending more than two (2) sessions is not permitted. Click 'Sign-Up' for your selected session.

During the listening session, a facilitator will guide the group through a series of activities

where you can share your experiences, perceptions, concerns, and needs as a member of the LGBTQ+ community of the Greater Mahoning Valley. It will take about 90 minutes, and as a thank-you, you will receive a \$30 gift card. Gift cards must be claimed in person to avoid scams and artificial intelligence (AI) chatbots from falsely obtaining incentives.

Your privacy is important! We won't use your name or personal info in any reports. If you're under 18, your parent or guardian needs to sign a permission form for you to participate and receive your gift card.

We don't expect any big risks, but you can choose not to answer any questions you don't want to. If you have any concerns or questions, contact Andrew M. Snyder at asnyde20@kent.edu or call 216.672.7330. This research has been approved by Kent State University Institutional Review Board and is being facilitated by The Center for Community Solutions.

The "Red Zone" is a critical and often overlooked period on college campuses, referring to the first six to eight weeks of the academic year when students, particularly freshmen, are at the highest risk for sexual assault. This period is marked by a convergence of factors that make new students especially vulnerable, including their unfamiliarity with campus resources, a desire to fit in, and increased social activity, often involving alcohol.

During the Red Zone, incoming students are navigating new social environments and building relationships, which can sometimes lead to situations where boundaries are crossed. The pressures of adapting to college life can also make students less likely to recognize or avoid risky situations.
