Last month's LGBT Fund event considered a major success

It was billed as a Community Convening that took place on January 13 at the Erie Community Foundation. Organized by the LGBT Fund of the Foundation, the event brought together leaders of local organizations, businesses, religious congregations, and others who serve and support the Erie region's LGBTQ+ community.

There were approximately 40 individuals in attendance at the gathering, for which Bill Gonda, chair of the LGBT Fund, was most pleased. "It was rewarding to see so many of the attendees talking to each other and exchanging information about the activities they had developed," said Bill. "I could almost feel that collaborative efforts would result from the evening."

While notice of the event was sent to all addresses on the Community Foundation mailing list, Bill said he was most grateful to Michael Mahler, editor of the Erie Gay News, who helped get the word out. "Because Michael attends so many activities in our community, he made sure that notice of our event was received by leaders of all LGBTQ+ organizations in the area."

The primary reason for the outreach program is to explore ways the LGBT Fund might help

strengthen the work these groups are doing to make life better for LGBTQ+ individuals in our region, according to Bill. The January 13th gathering began at 5:30 pm and was meant to wrap up by 7 pm, "but the exchange between attendees was going so well we could have been there until 10 pm." Unfortunately, not too much information was presented about how groups can apply for financial assistance from the fund. Bill suggested that those interested contact lgbt@eriecommunityfoundation.org. Applications for Erie Community Foundation grants will open in the fall to all 501 (c) (3) nonprofit LGBT organizations.

Dr. Tyler Titus elected president of Erie City Council

On Wednesday, January 7, Erie City Council unanimously elected Dr. Tyler Titus council president. With this election, they became the first openly transgender person in the commonwealth to hold that position. Titus, a former Erie School director, was elected to Erie City Council in 2023 and served as vice president in 2025.

Our community is mourning the loss of Char Brower on January 13, 2026, a 21-year-old non-binary person whose life was defined by compassion, curiosity, and a deep commitment to dignity for all. Char moved through the world with care and intention, making people (and animals) feel seen, valued, and safe.

Char held a deep love for learning and a natural understanding of justice, particularly disability justice and the ways class, race, gender, ability, and sexuality shape lived experience. Even at a young age, they carried a rare depth of insight that enriched every space they entered. Char instinctively centered consent, respect, and autonomy. No one felt othered in their presence; people felt honored, heard, and respected.

If you met Char, you were changed. They had a rare ability to invite others to shed older versions of themselves and step into newer, more compassionate ways of being. In their presence, people felt less guarded, more human, and more whole. When Char left this realm, we lost a profound light and with them went the versions of ourselves shaped by their presence. What remains is the responsibility to grow forward.

Char is deeply missed. May we all strive to be more like Char. Their work is now ours to continue.

It is with profound sadness that we announce the passing of David A. Duguay, 49, of Cranesville, who passed away on Monday, December 22, 2025, at St. Vincent Hospital, surrounded by his family.

Dave graduated from Girard High School in 1995. Following high school, he worked in a variety of positions, including bartending at local bars and working at several restaurants. He was also employed at the Erie International Airport, where he worked in ticket sales for Piedmont Airlines as well as in the airport restaurants. Dave later worked as a correctional officer at the State Correctional Institution in Albion and most recently at PHB Machining in Fairview.

He was an active man, venturing out almost always with friends, to breath and hike in the outdoors and kayak on Lake Erie. When home he took great care of his garden each year. He was independent and felt proud of keeping his space the way he saw fit. In quiet evenings he enjoyed music, a talented musician. Dave had a gift for most brass instruments, playing throughout his life, learning many songs. He also enjoyed working out and staying in shape, even competing in the Beast on the Bay obstacle course for years on end. Above all, Dave cherished spending time with his family.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his sisters, Lisa Duguay, Laura Duguay, and Renea Duguay; his brother, David Duguay; and his furry companion, Cisco, whom Dave loved very deeply.

Dave will be deeply missed by his family, including his sisters, Christine Pustelak (Gary) and Cathlene Duguay (Matt); his twin brother, Douglas Duguay; his brothers, Steven Duguay and John Duguay (Ethelia); and his “niblings,” Chloe, Caden, Morgan, Bobby, Dana, Dylan, Sadie, Benny, Bobbi Jo, Tricia, and Joey; his longtime neighbors and friends, the Crane Family.

Founded in 2007 by Mary Lynn Rote, LPC, CADC, ABCs of Building Better Lives has grown into a trusted resource for mental health and wellness in Erie. With over three decades of experience, Rote leads a diverse team of licensed counselors and social workers dedicated to addressing a wide spectrum of concerns, from anxiety and depression to trauma and addiction. Their work is grounded in a whole-person approach that honors each individual's identity and lived experience.

ABCs offers a comprehensive range of services, from individual, couples, and family counseling to support with trauma, addictions, grief, and life transitions. Their practice is rooted in evidence-based techniques such as CBT, EMDR, DBT, and the Gottman Method, while maintaining a compassionate, client-centered approach. In addition to mental health counseling, ABCs also provides health and wellness services, educational offerings, and yoga classes. The organization further embraces alternative paths to healing through counseling experiences in nature and walking sessions.

What sets ABCs apart is its strong commit-

Housing Survey on Affordability & Stability in Pennsylvania's LGBTQ+ Community

On January 15, the Pennsylvania Equality Project will be starting year 4 of a five-year study on housing affordability and stability for Pennsylvania's LGBTQ+ and other marginalized communities. Participants can find the survey on our website paequality.com - click on the Survey button. All survey responses will remain confidential, and we will release only aggregated data following the survey without any identifying information about participants. The

survey will run through March 31; results from the survey will be available by May 15, 2026.

Analysis of the data from the first three years shows that 102 of 186 (54.8%) rented households can barely afford their current residence. In broader terms, 130 of the 186 (69.9%) of respondents who rent their current residence can either barely afford or not afford their housing expenses. While 7.1% of the entire population of Pennsylvania who rent are at risk for eviction, within the LGBTQ+ community, the 69.9% total potentially facing eviction is substantially larger than it should be.

“The Way We Were”: The Aging with Pride Legacy Project Interviews Begin

The Aging with Pride Legacy Project continues work on the development of a formal historical archive capturing the development and evolution of LGBTQIA+ culture in Erie. While newspaper articles, timelines and photographs set the historical stage of an archive, recorded oral histories add dimensions of personal experience, motivation and an emotional context connected to past events.

During the past month, the Legacy Project Team completed interviews with several Erie area residents specific to their experiences as members of the LGBTQIA+ community. Some participants described experiences prior to the presence of LGBTQIA+ gathering spaces and organizations in the Erie Area. Others reported experiences of “coming out” in an environment when supportive organizations and agencies were present. Housing, employment and healthcare were discussed in other interviews.

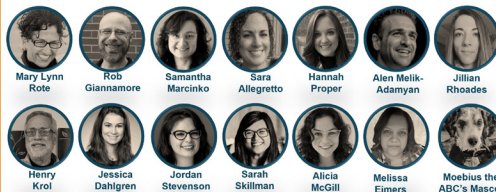

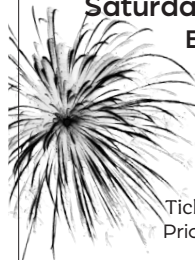

The "Red Zone" is a critical and often overlooked period on college campuses, referring to the first six to eight weeks of the academic year when students, particularly freshmen, are at the highest risk for sexual assault. This period is marked by a convergence of factors that make new students especially vulnerable, including their unfamiliarity with campus resources, a desire to fit in, and increased social activity, often involving alcohol.

During the Red Zone, incoming students are navigating new social environments and building relationships, which can sometimes lead to situations where boundaries are crossed. The pressures of adapting to college life can also make students less likely to recognize or avoid risky situations.
